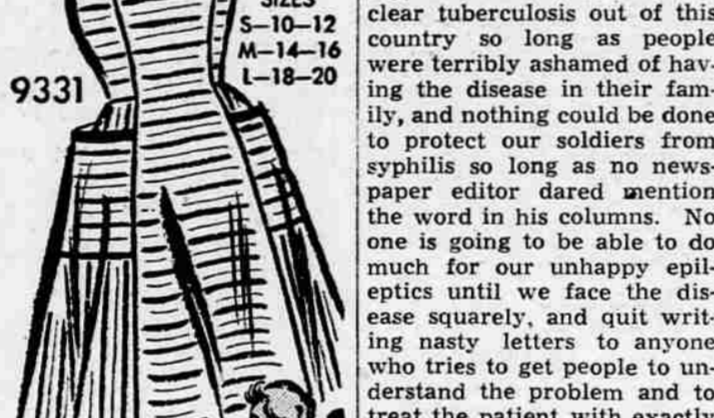
3 DAYS TO CURTAIN TIME

According to a recent release by the National Association for Mental Health the number of residents in state and county mental hospitals stands at 545,000. In 1958, the number of admissions was 210,000 compared with 195,000 in 1957. Of the 228 mental institutions inspected by the American Psychiatric Association, only 34 were approved.

I read that the "Open Hospital" policy, which gives many of the patients in a mental hospital much freedom—perhaps even to go into town, is becoming more and more widespread throughout the country. It makes the patients much happier, and speeds their recovery. Recently, when I was visiting with my old friend, Dr. Francis Braceland, head of the fine Institute of Family Relations, in Hartford, Conn., I asked the nurses if many of their patients took French leave, and they said, "No, not many." Usually, when a patient fails to show up, all they have to do is look around through the nearby bars and cocktail lounges, and there they will find their man. They say to him, "Come on, bed-time," and back to the hospital he goes.

It is good to read that the number of community mental health clinics is increasing. Already, new laws are encouraging the formation of such clinics, and in many cases helping to finance them. Such clinics help in the treatment, rehabilitation and education of mentally disturbed people. Let us all keep remembering that mental disease is the commonest disease there is in this country, and our worst problem next to the threat of war.

Eisenhower Vetoes Alaska Lease Bill

Gettysburg, Pa. — (UPI) — President Eisenhower today vetoed a bill which would double the maximum allowable holdings of oil and gas leases and options in Alaska. He said it was short-sighted and unsound.

In a message to the House, where the bill originated, the President said the measure might be of short-run financial help to the new state of Alaska but that: "... I believe this to be a short-sighted goal for it eventually could well result in depriving both the Alaskan and federal government of substantial revenue. Sacrificing sound principle and the long-run public interest in order to achieve a limited immediate gain does not seem to me to be wise."
