Gene Fullmer May Use Lefty Attack in Ring

San Francisco - (UPI) - Gene Fullmer may switch to a southpaw attack in his world middleweight championship bout with Carmen Basilio Aug. 23 at the Cow Palace. That's what Fullmer's manager, Marv Jensen intimated Thursday.

"I can tell you that we will be ready with everything in this fight with Basilio," Jensen said. "We are aware that Basilio didn't look too good in his fights against southpaw Chuck Davey."

Basilio fought Davey twice in 1952, losing once and gaining a draw. When informed of the verbal jabs, Basilio countered: "It doesn't make any difference to me whether he fights southpaw or right-handed. The main thing is that he'll have to fight three minutes of every round and may not have time to switch."

Both fighters continued intensive training today for the NBA version of the middleweight title.

Clay, Ray Mix In TV Tangle

Philadelphia - (UPI) - Undeclared Von Clay, promising young light heavyweight, hopes to gain a foothold among the contenders tonight when he meets fourth-ranked Sonny Ray of Chicago in a nationally televised 10-round bout here.

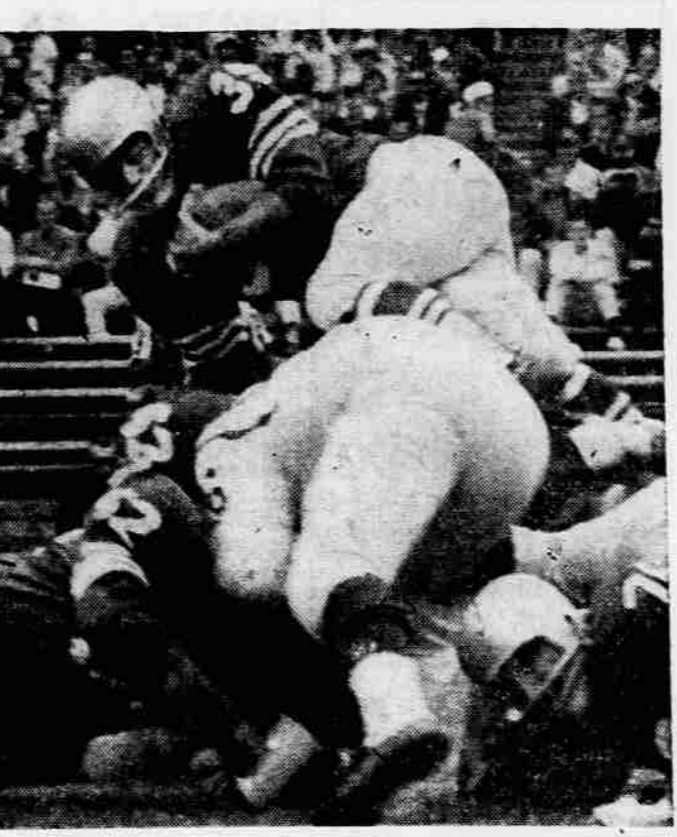
Ray, 20, who gained national prominence with a surprise knockout of Jesse Bowdry, is confident that his superior ring knowledge will be the deciding factor.
