

### Machinists Go On Strike in Coast Shipyards

San Francisco—UPI—The International Association of Machinists went on strike at West Coast shipyards today in a labor dispute that may idle an estimated 10,000 workers. Pickets appeared shortly before 7 a.m. today at the main gate of Bethlehem Steel's Shipbuilding yard, the largest San Francisco shipbuilder involved. The plant employs 2,300 workers.

**Others Expected**  
About 1,200 West Coast machinists were actually expected to strike in California, Oregon and Washington, but about 8,000 members of other unions were also affected.

Representatives for the employers met with the union's bargaining committee and a federal conciliator, Ralph C. Patterson, for 3½ hours Sunday, but a union spokesman said no new wage offer was made by the employer group.

Patterson asked both sides to meet again today. The union said it would meet at any time, but would establish picket lines with the first shift today. Employers indicated they would not meet if the strike was called.

**Package Deal Offered**  
The machinists have been offered a 24-cent package increase over a two-year period. Union spokesman Floyd Smith, Seattle, said the union refused to accept less than a 32-cent package. The old contract expired June 31.

Other shipyard workers in the metals trades unions are currently voting on the 24-cent package increase. The metals trade union leaders have recommended acceptance, but the machinists turned the offer down in a membership vote.

Approximately half the 1,200 machinists involved are in the San Francisco Bay area, and 8,000 other shipyard workers on the Pacific coast could be affected by the walkout.

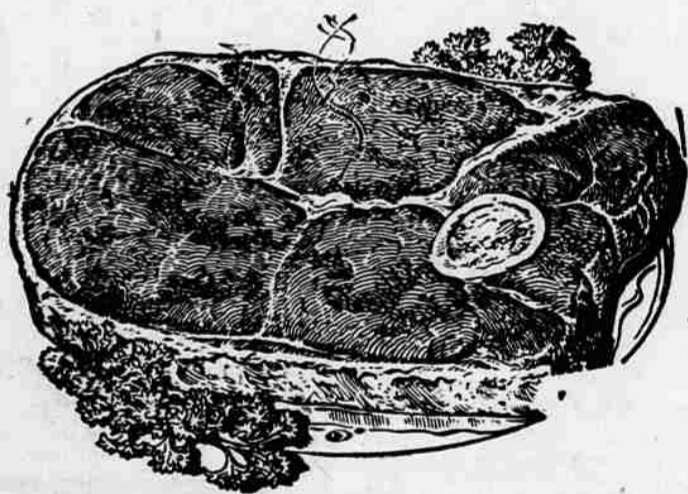
