Adhesions and Ptois

Thousands of people are still being operated on for "adhesions," but I doubt if many get any result. I think that by now this operation has a largely negative effect on the patient. In my 25 years at the Mayo Clinic, I doubt if I've seen a single patient in for an operation for adhesions. Many a person, when the abdomen was opened for some reason, were found full of adhesions, but seldom did the surgeons believe that these adhesions had caused the distresses complained of. When adhesions are cut or pulled apart, they are likely to form again.

Commonly, after an operation, the adhesions that formed tend to loosen up. Only rarely do they cause intestinal obstruction. I remember many patients who, at an abdominal operation for something or other, were found to be full of adhesions, and yet they had had neither indigestion, abdominal pain, nor constipation. That is why very able surgeons will say that they do not know if adhesions produce symptoms; and if they do, we physicians do not yet know what these symptoms are. All I know is that every year I see many persons who were once operated on for adhesions, and they say they did not get any good or permanent result.

Hope to Satisfy

I am afraid that often when we physicians are in a hurry; when the waiting-room is full, and some woman holds us up to ask why her abdomen is so uncomfortable, instead of saying that we have not yet determined what the trouble is, or instead of spending half an hour trying to explain that several things might cause her distress, or that almost certainly it is due to nervousness, we are inclined to hazard a guess that and to hope that at least for a time this will satisfy her.

Through the years we doctors have tended to use for the purpose of satisfying patients quickly a number of diagnoses which, for a while, have become popular. For instance, when I was a young man, one of the most popular diagnoses with which to quiet a patient was "intestinal auto-intoxication." It is very questionable if there ever was such a disease, but many people liked the term and it satisfied them. It sounded reasonable.

For years, another very popular diagnosis was "chronic appendicitis." I am glad to say that recently it has been going out of fashion. In some hospitals today the man who makes this diagnosis too frequently is soon denied the privileges of the operating-rooms. In the last year the number of appendices removed from adults has dropped by one half.

Dropping of Stomach

About 1915, with the coming into use of modern x-ray machines, some of us doctors became much interested in "ptosis" or the supposed dropping of the stomach and bowel below the level where we had assumed that it should be. We spoke of gastroptosis, coloptosis, and nephroptosis, depending on whether we thought the stomach, or the colon, or the kidney was a little lower than normal. For a while some surgeons were

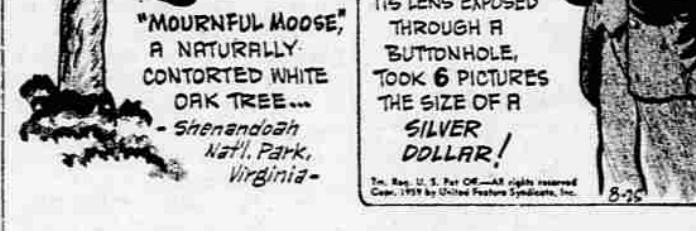
