

Doubling Dates Ida M. Pardue

This is a game you can make with two pages from a monthly calendar. Rule the numbered days off into neat squares and cut them apart. You'll want an equal number of days for each month, so if one page has 31 and the other 30, throw away the extra date. Scatter the squares, numbers down, on a table or on the floor. Each player takes six squares and turns them face up. At the word GO, players start turning over the other squares on the table, trying to find doubles for their own six squares. Unwanted numbers are turned face down again. The first player to find doubles for each of his numbers wins the game.

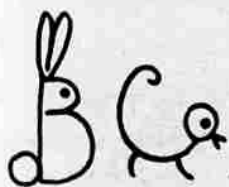

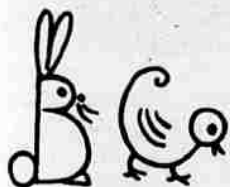
