450 Labor Day Deaths Predicted
Chicago—UPI—America's last fling at summer vacation fun may be the last fling, period, for 450 motorists, the National Safety Council said today. The council predicted that 450 persons may be killed in one of the biggest traffic jams in the nation's history during the Labor Day week end. Virtually every one of the 71 million automobiles in the United States will be on the road at some time between 6 p.m. Friday and midnight Monday, the council said. Together, they'll roll up a predicted seven billion miles of travel as vacationers seek a respite from work and relief from the heat at the seashore, in the mountains or in other recreational pursuits. Salem—UPI—Oregon has had 307 traffic deaths so far this year compared to 278 at the same period last year. There have been 60 deaths so far in August compared to 54 on Aug. 31 of 1958.

The Medical Roundup

Neurodermatitis

People want to know what neurodermatitis is. It means a trouble with the skin which is to a person's nervousness, anxiety, unhappiness, or mental strain. For instance, in one of the worst cases of neurodermatitis I ever saw, the woman had a big area of "weeping eczema" on one arm. I found she was faced with a difficult problem in her life—a problem that she hadn't been able to make up her mind about. When I got her to make up her mind, the skin lesion cleared up in a few days. Many another woman has come in with a terrible itching of her crotch, which was nearly driving her crazy.

Again, often, I have that she was trying to decide some difficult question such as, should she leave her husband. When she decided either to stay or to leave, the itching was greatly relieved. I remember the first woman I ever saw with a neurodermatitis. She got a patch of it on the side of her neck that itched so that it nearly drove her crazy. Soon I found that what had happened was that her husband's f-m had discovered that he had been stealing their money and using it to gamble on the horses, and they were trying to make up their mind whether to let him try to pay some back, or to send him to jail. It was this uncertainty that was gnawing at her heart.

A woman came in one day with hives as big as silver dollars scattered all over her body, and itching terribly. Her trouble was that, after having married a man she did not love, she met her old beau and found she was still much in love with him. The question then was, should she divorce her husband and marry the old beau. She just couldn't make up her mind, and with this, her skin broke out. I told her not to waste money on doctoring, but to go home and make a decision.

The Woman who Urinates Every 15 Minutes
The other day a woman came in to say that, for a week, she had been running to the toilet to urinate every 15 minutes all day. She said she had been to a urologist who had cystoscoped her and studied her carefully, but he hadn't found anything wrong. I just asked if she had any frequency at night, and she said, "No." After she got to sleep she slept comfortably till morning. Then I said, "You must be very anxious or upset about something." She looked at me, so surprised, and said, "Could it be that?" I said, "What can't you make up your mind about?" She said her kind boss had offered to advance her the money to go to New York and learn to use one of the new calculating machines. On her return, he would give her a more interesting and more remunerative job. She very much wanted to go, but she feared that if she were away from home for a few months her beau would get to roving, and she might lose him. Hence she had been spending her days trying to make up her mind. A few days later she reported that she had decided to go, and with this, her urinary urgency disappeared. Anyone who urinates every 15 minutes by day but not by night usually has a mental problem to solve.

Parents Urged to Set Good Example

Parents are urged by the Medford Safety Council to set a proper example in traffic for school children, now that back-to-school time is near. "Parents," the council said, "should teach their children to stop, look and listen before crossing streets or railroad tracks. Don't expect a child to obey a rule you violate." Accidents are the leading cause of death to school-age children, the council said. More than 2,500 children 5-14 years of age are killed annually in accidents involving motor vehicles and more than 1,100 of them are pedestrians. The council said that a total of 150,000 children in the 5-14 age group are injured each year in motor vehicle mishaps and that one out of 12 students injured in a "school jurisdiction" accident is on his way to or from school. Some council suggestions to motorists are: "Keep your car in good condition. Pay special attention to tires and brakes. Drive slowly near schools and slow down where children are walking or playing. Expect the unexpected from children."

Polio Vaccine Taken by Bandits

Montreal—UPI—Medical authorities and police officials theorized today four masked bandits stole 75,000 Salk polio vaccine shots for bootlegging on a black market.

A high incidence of polio in the city and other parts of Quebec lent credence to the theory that a black market was operating, police said.

Authorities have reported 536 cases, including 29 fatal, since the outbreak of the epidemic seven weeks ago. However, the outbreak is considered decreasing.

Police said they had received reports the vaccine may be bootlegged for as much as \$25 a vial, which would raise the value of the stolen vaccine to \$250,000.
