

Mission 66 Now Reaching Maturity

Washington (Science Service) — The country's national parks are in the best shape they have ever been in, thanks largely to Mission 66.

The ten-year Mission 66 program of park conservation and development, launched July 1, 1956, "is now reaching maturity in its effectiveness," National Park Service director Conrad L. Wirth said here. More than \$96 million has been spent so far, Mr. Wirth reported. Major improvement projects include the addition of 218 permanent employees to manage, protect and maintain the parks, new visitor centers, camp-sites, roads, walks and trails, and new road-side and trail-side exhibits. Thousands of acres of new park land have been acquired by purchase, donation, transfer or exchange.

Planning is also underway, he explained, to learn more about the recreational potential of the Columbia and Delaware river basins as well as the potential of northwest California.

Phone Users Want Change

Salem — (UPI) — Telephone users in the Marcola exchange of the Pacific Telephone and Telegraph company want extended area service to Eugene-Springfield, ballot figures released by the public utilities commission indicated today.

Out of a potential vote of 187, the PUC said, 149 were for the change-over, four were against extended service and two would have gone either way.

A decision on the toll-free service will be made by the PUC later.

H. D. Force, and son, Dave, and daughter, Miss Judi Force, spent Aug. 29 at Crescent City, Calif.

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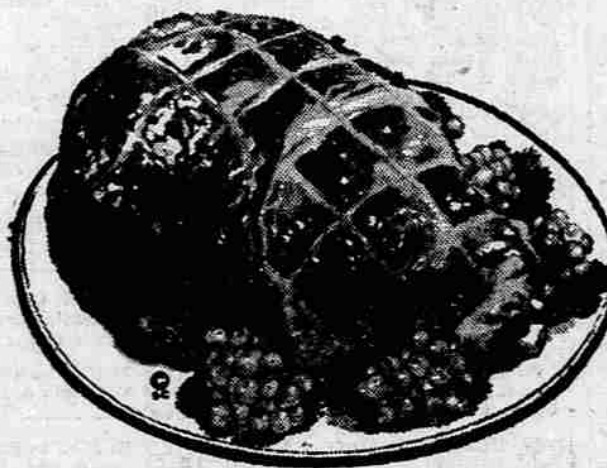
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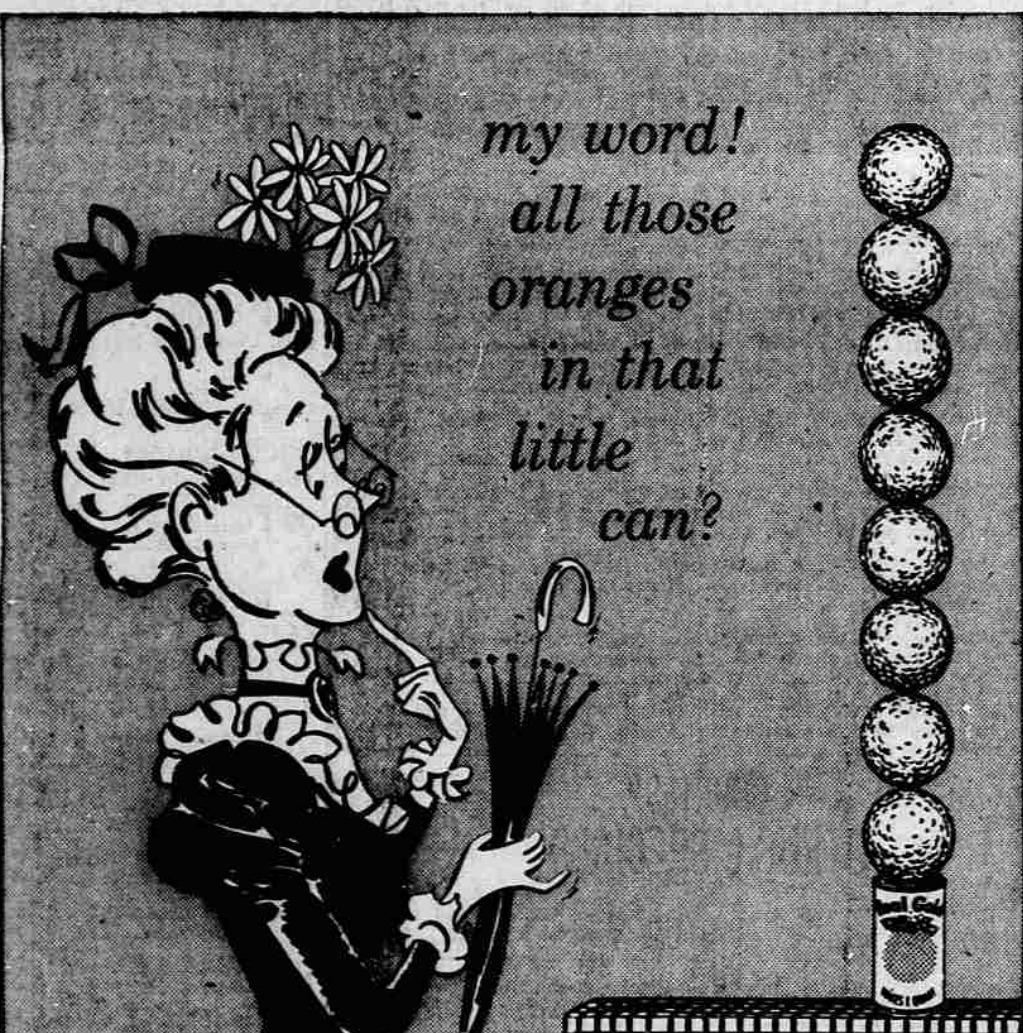
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
