Small Worlds Around Us

Pollywog Is Lucky if He Makes the Change to Frog "Poll" means head, and "w-3" means wriggle. Put them together to make a rather musical and meaningful name—pollywog. It's another way of saying "tadpole," one of the most familiar of the many creatures that inhabit fresh water ponds.

Someone with a flair for the ridiculous and a slight sense of rhetoric coined the sentence describing the tadpole when he said, "The pollywog wiggled its tail." Every boy and all adults who have ever watched the pollywog know it has to waggle its tail in order to get anywhere at all. Although the tadpole must lead an aquatic life, it has no fins. But it does have gills, and a digestive system adjusted to a purely vegetable diet.

Has Back During the tadpole state it is even equipped with a sharp beak at the tip end of the mouth, suitable to grazing or nibbling on the leaves and stems of water plants. When it finally evolves into an adult frog, the beak will be gone in favor of a very wide mouth and an appetite for flesh.

Even its bony skeleton, as well as the muscles and lungs, will have undergone a radical change. It will grow legs; the rear ones first, then the right forearm, then the left forearm, which will appear just about where a breathing pore was located. While in the tadpole state the power of limb rejuvenation and renewal is very strong. It can grow a new limb whenever one is

lost. Once it becomes a frog it cannot duplicate this phenomenal feat. A frog who loses a leg must remain a cripple forever.

During the larva or tadpole state the eyes are without lids. But once the transformation is complete, with internal lungs instead of gills and all the other body changes, it will develop eyelids, and will be able to blink them. From tadpole, awkward and rather sluggish, to adult frog is a period of many complex changes. He's lucky if he makes them all.

Awkward Body The pollywog has an awkward, bulbous, out-of-shape body, following somewhat the form of a poorly shaped teardrop. The little creature "wags" itself along in a sort of sculling motion, progressing forward in short spurts of speed only at the expense of considerable effort.

To come up to the surface of his pond he has to practically "knock himself out." Once at the surface he gasps at a mouthful of air, then scurries for the bottom.

Soon after the legs develop, the little creature crawls ashore or up on a lily-pod. He now has a wide mouth, internal gills and a beautiful, streamlined, ribless body with a soft, lustrous skin—a skin porous enough to absorb oxygen through itself. Slowly, the tail, no longer needed, is completely absorbed, (people used to think it fell off) and the amphibian is created. The complex transformation from pollywog to frog is again successfully completed.

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Wall Street Chatter

Polio Epidemic Continues in State

Portland — (UPI)—The State Board of Health said Wednesday Oregon's polio epidemic continues to worsen with unofficial reports of 10 additional cases and one possible death throughout the state.

If confirmed, the news reports would push Oregon's polio toll so far this year to 89 cases and five deaths. This is more than four times the number of cases reported at the same period a year ago.

The Health Board Tuesday designated Oregon as a polio epidemic area following official reports of 33 cases during the past two weeks.

Dr. Harold Erickson, state health officer, again appealed for widespread Salk vaccination of children and adults to halt the outbreak.

Resources Board Meets at La Grande

Salem — (UPI)—The State Water Resources Board will meet at La Grande Sept. 16 at 9:30 a.m.

The board staff will present the findings and conclusions of the Grande Ronde river basin investigation at that time. It includes studies of beneficial uses of water including domestic, municipal, irrigation, power development, industrial, mining, recreation, wildlife and fish life uses. Pollution abatement, drainage and reclamation also were studied.

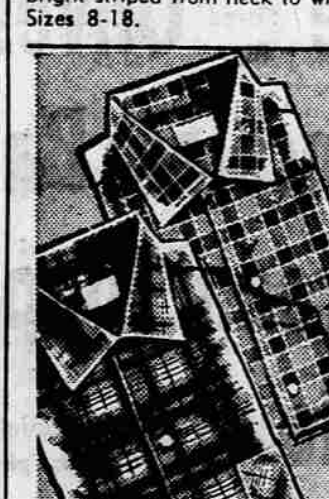
