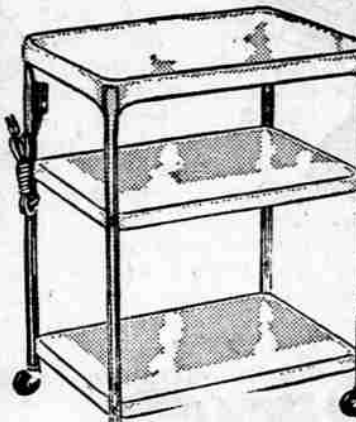

The first fall meeting of Bethel 55, International Order of Job's Daughters, will be held in Pythian hall Tuesday, September 8. Friendship night will be observed.

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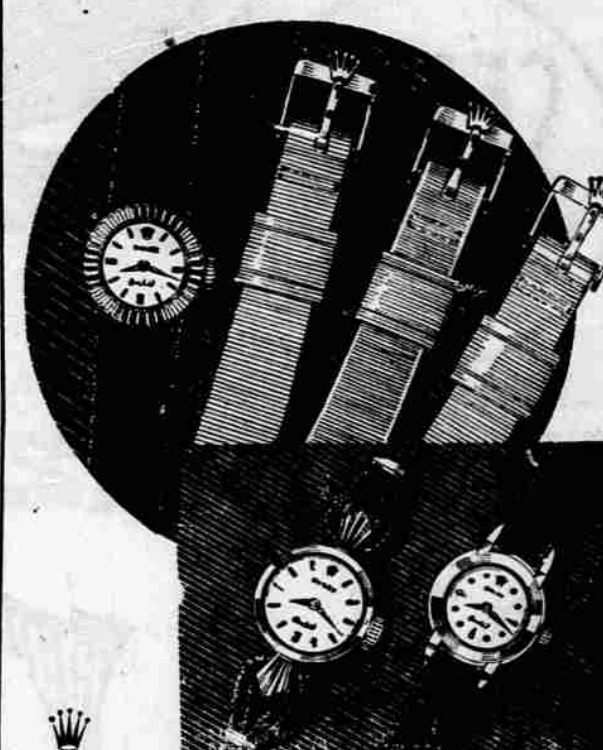


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
