Canyonville Home Plans Announced

Canyonville - Plans for construction of a six-story, 100-room retirement home at Canyonville have been announced.

Dr. Rollin Falk, administrator for the Forest Glen Clinic, said the home is scheduled to be in operation before the end of 1960. He said the home will be operated in conjunction with Forest Glen Clinic, but as a separate unit.

Cost of the proposed building is estimated at \$600,000 to \$750,000. Dr. Falk said the home will cater to retired persons in the lower income brackets. Plans call for a charge of \$1,500 as a membership fee and \$110 to \$120 a month.

Kiewit Submits Low Bid for Road Work

Portland-Peter Kiewit Sons' company, Medford, was apparent low bidder for grading 4,464 miles of the Lake of the Woods highway in Jackson county, the bureau of public roads has announced.

Kiewit bid \$295,434 on Alternate B, which calls for the contractor to dispose of timber cleared from the right-of-way. Kiewit did not bid on Alternate A, under which timber would be stacked.

Government estimate for either alternate was \$538,771. The section to be graded extends eastward from the west boundary of Rogue River National forest, paralleling the north fork of Little Butte creek.

There were 21 bidders submitting bids ranging up to \$772,283.
