Sharp Drop Noted On Stock Market

New York—(UPI)—The stock market suffered one of its sharpest setbacks of the year today on increased volume. The sharp drop wiped off more than \$5 billion from stock values before the mar-

ket met some support. Individual losses of 2 and 3 points dotted the main list. Disappointment over the failure of steel wage negotiations to come up with an agreement and predictions the strike may run through September dealt a severe blow to market sentiment. Youngstown was off more than 5 at its low but rallied before the close. U. S. Steel, Bethlehem and Republic all were under pressure. Carpenter Steel lost more than 4 at its low.
