Water-Scorpion Utilizes Ball and Socket Joint

Nature devised a pretty clever gadget when she perfected the ball and socket joint in the human shoulder making it possible for our arms to rotate in any direction, even in a complete circle.

Nature must have appreciated the usefulness of the "ball and socket" for she used it in many of her subjects. Man, with all his inventive ingenuity, has never been able to improve on it. This same sort of joint comes in pretty handy to that grotesque creature of the fresh water ponds, named because of its bodily similarity

to its dry land counterpart, the water-scorpion.

What makes the bodily resemblance so startling, between the true scorpion and this character called the water-scorpion, is the breathing tube attached to the posterior end of the animal that looks like the stinging tail of the true scorpion. This breathing tube or snorkel is attached to the creature's body with a true "ball and socket" joint, which cleverly adjusts itself to any position, making it possible for the animal to rest, eat or seize its prey under water while the snorkel is bringing in fresh air from above. And all the time we thought the invention of the snorkel submarine was something we originated.

The water-scorpion, often measuring as much as three inches in length, has stout forelegs, a long, slim body and pincer-like claws suited to grasping and holding its prey. It feeds on aquatic insects, tadpoles and small fish. Once the prey is seized in the tongue-like claws, the water-scorpion plunges its sharp beak into the victim and injects a paralyzing chemical which renders the prey incapable of movement.

Then the victim is held while the beak sucks out the body juices, all the time breathing fresh air through

The snorkel, which extends above the water's surface, its ball and socket arrangement adjusting itself to any body position.

Some species of this aquatic creature are equipped with wings but seldom do they attempt to fly, and then only at night. People who have found them, dazed by flying into street lights, have been impressed by the creature's resemblance to a crawfish or a miniature lobster.

The female water-scorpion deposits her eggs in a cleft she cuts in the stem of an underwater plant. Each egg is decorated or adorned with several thread-like extensions. The true purpose of these extensions is, so far, unknown.

Some scientists hold to the idea the threads assist, in some strange manner, oxygen reaching the developing creature inside the egg. The ball and socket joint we can understand, as well as the breathing tube, but there seems no obvious reason why an egg should be equipped with "breathing filaments."

Miss America Contest Takes Modesty Turn

Atlantic City, N. J. — UPI — Officials of the Miss America Pageant took a giant step today in their efforts to de-emphasize the contest. They banned bathing beauty from the beach.

One of the two main activities on the second day of the annual pageant in the past had been an appearance on the beach by the contestants to pose for their official photographs while crowds on the boardwalk watched.

But no more. The 54 entrants in this 32nd contest to choose a Miss America will be posing today around a swimming pool — at the Marlborough-Blenheim Hotel.

Trend Toward Modesty

The pool is outdoors but well shielded from the admiring eyes of the throngs lured to Atlantic City to see the Miss America Pageant.

Abandoning the beach is part of a general beauty contest trend toward modesty. The Long Beach Miss Universe bathing beauty contest has been terminated, and Mrs. America long ago discarded her swim suit for a house dress.

Officials of the Miss America Pageant frankly admit that they are looking for more than beauty in their queen — one who can tour the country making up to 10 speeches a day during her year-long reign.

Once Miss America is crowned, next Saturday night, she is barred from public appearances in a swim suit, and the poses she assumes fully clad for photographs are closely supervised.

Talent Counts Half

Twenty-five per cent of the judges' final decision is based on how girls look in bathing suits. Twenty-five per cent is on how they look in evening gowns and how poised they are over the breakfast table. The other 50 per cent is talent-singing, dancing, painting, playing the flute, reciting "The White Cliffs of Dover," or whatever each girl does best.

Asking Said Best Way to Find Out What Consumers Desire

New York — UPI — In this changing economy of ours, the best way to find out what consumers want is to go right out and ask them.

That's a bit of advice from Ford, Bacon & Davis, 65-year-old business consulting and engineering firm. The firm has just published a pamphlet entitled "The Growing Importance of Market Research as a Basis for Policy Decisions."

With more firms turning to market research to determine if they can sell products, the company warns that "The opportunities for making a wrong decision are increasing while the corresponding costs of such decisions also are becoming greater."

Even with statistics on hand it is a mistake to rely upon them entirely says the company.

"Changes may be in process

which will alter the future growth rates or other market characteristics.

"Calls on a representative number of customers, actual or potential, may indicate trends which the figures don't show."

"Here again the trends are important, and often there is no substitute for shoe leather in bringing them to light."

Changing conditions stand out in many things, it is pointed out. For example, canned fruit per capita consumption has leveled off while that for frozen fruit has risen sharply. Millwork production in wood products has declined, while softwood plywood production has soared.

Population changes have been big factors in determining market size. From 1940 to 1950 the population of California has risen 108 per cent and Florida has risen 34 per cent compared with 32 per cent for the whole nation.

Occupational Changes, Too

Also there have been many occupational changes. Service occupations have risen sharply with the result that we have a larger proportion of white collar workers. Farm workers have declined more than any other group. Manual laborers are off substantially.

Also there have been changes in the age groups with the younger ones up sharply.

And there are the other changes involved in introduction of electronics, nuclear power, substitution of low cost mechanical and electrical energy for high cost human energy, and many new materials—plastics, synthetic fibers, and new chemical products.

With all these, business men have difficulty today in launching new products, building additional plants, and acquiring growing businesses.

Ford, Bacon & Davis warns against too great a reliance on statistical projection in industry forecasting.

"No Longer Accurate Guide

"Conditions in the industry may have changed due to technological developments and other causes," the firm says, "and the records of the past no longer may provide an accurate guide for the future."

"Often a field survey will uncover changes in trends which would be taken into consideration in forecasting industry sales."

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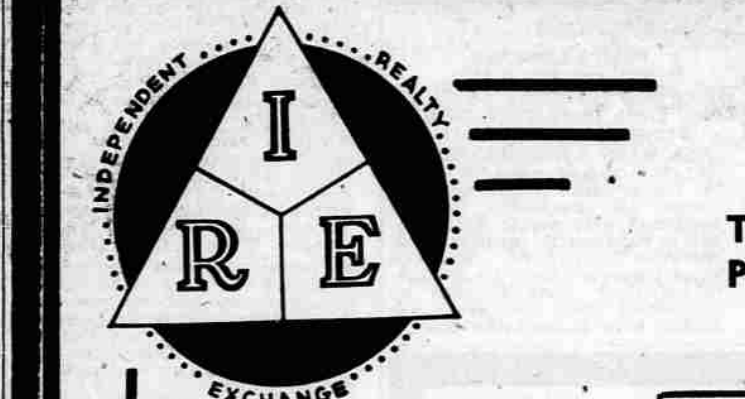
