Problem Children and Irritable People

Recently I heard a remarkable talk by Dr. Leon Oettinger who, in the Los Angeles schools,

has been making a particular study of problem children and children who cannot learn to read or write easily. He said that what he had found

was that when he got electroencephalograms made of all these children, he found 67 per cent of them with abnormalities in the little electric currents — abnormalities such as commonly are found in epileptics. That these findings were not meaningless was shown by the fact that often, when he gave the child an anti-epileptic drug, the next day the teacher reported a decided improvement in the child's behavior, and sometimes in his writing and reading.

The child would be less restless in school, he would be better behaved, less hostile to other children, and more amenable to discipline. Some of the children, when given a little Dextedrin, also improved in a remarkable way, again showing that there was something physically wrong with their brain; something that could be improved with the help of a drug. The child hadn't been simply "bad" as he had been thought to be before; he had been ill. Often the doctors learned that he had a few forebears who were bad-tempered or violent or alcoholic or eccentric or "bad actors."

Some Mental Disturbance Usually, when I see a child like this, and when I can get the parents to talk to me honestly and frankly, I can find that among the parents, grandparents, and uncles and aunts — or sometimes cousins, nieces and nephews, there was some mental disturbance; sometimes a definite psychosis; a "nervous breakdown;" sometimes an inability to work or to be a useful member of society. Often, what I heard was that the father or the grandfather had been a bad-tempered man, very hard to get along with.

Meteor Stream Rediscovered

New Haven, Conn. (Science Service) — A "lost" meteor stream, which gave the spectacular Andromedid heavenly displays of "shooting stars" in 1885, has been rediscovered by astronomical detective work using photographic plates.

Three astronomers from Harvard College observatory and Boston university found 23 meteors during a five-year period that follow the orbit of the comet causing the Andromedid shower. These are the remnants of the swarm, they report in the current Astronomical Journal, published here.

When observed in 1875, the meteor stream was 400,000 miles thick, Drs. Gerald S. Hawkins, Richard B. Southworth and Francis Stienon have calculated. In the last 100 years, the swarm has spread about considerably, resulting in a decline from about 15,000 meteors visible hourly in 1885 to about one every five hours at the present time.
