 Salt Lake City has its first Pacific Coast League pennant in history signed, sealed and delivered today.

Manager Larry Shepard's Bees wrapped up the flag Friday night with a rousing twin win over the Sacramento Solons, 3-2 and 11-3.

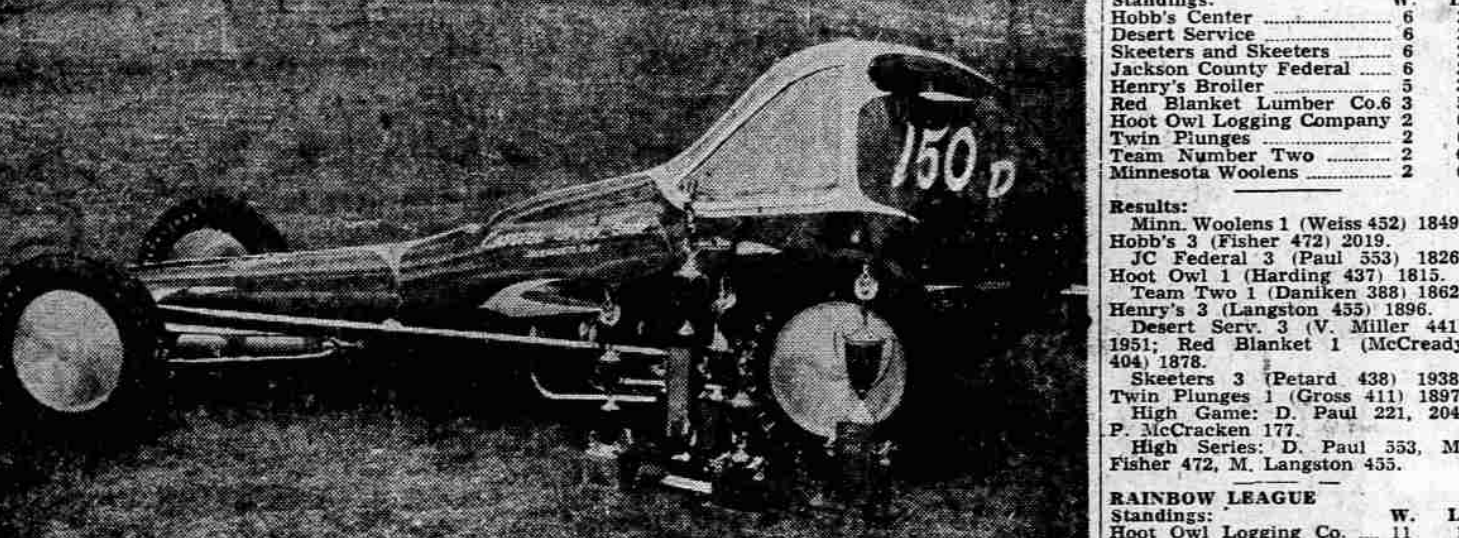
With only two games to play, the Bees have a two and a half game lead over second place Vancouver. The Mounties lost Friday night, 4-0.

The well balanced Bees, who lollered around the 500 mark during the first half of the season, won 25 of their last 37 games.

If you discount Dick Hall, the superb mound artist with machine like control who compiled an 18-5 record, you'd have to call the Bee triumph a solid team effort.

And little shortstop Dick Barone gave the Bees a scrappy hustler who did a solid job in the field and a better hitting performance than his .246 average, 10 homers, would indicate.

Three Entries Shatter Drag Strip Speed Marks

Three different dragster entries shattered the existing strip record of 144.46 miles per hour in yesterday's time trial competition at the Oregon Centennial Gas Championship drag races held on the Camp White drag strip. Other marks fell also as some of the west coast's best drag racing machines converged on the Southern Oregon Timing association strip for the two-day meet.

Top meet time for Saturday was recorded by a Reno entry at 145.44 miles per hour in the quarter-mile acceleration trap.

Close behind at 145.16 was an Oldsmobile-powered streamliner entry from Longview, Wash. entered by the racing team of Gorans and Jay. The sleek dragster broke the existing strip record of 144.46 mph on its first run.

Third entrant exceeding the former strip record was Paul Sutherland, Walnut Creek, Calif., who gunned his powerful fuel-injected supercharged Chrysler-powered entry to a top mark of 144.92 in yesterday's competition.

Outstanding entry

Another outstanding entry, the famous Glass Slipper from Sacramento, Calif., entered late in the afternoon and turned only 138.03 before time trials closed for the Saturday competition. The slipper crew were experiencing difficulties in fuel mixture and today hope to find the trouble and set much higher speeds.

Any of the machines mentioned are capable of breaking 150 mph today and some may reach speeds in excess of 160 mph.

Top time in the fuel injection for roadsters was recorded by the A Hot Roadster entry driven by Bob Hansen from Walnut Creek, Calif. Hanson's sleek roadster, running special fuel, sped through the electronic timing clocks at a speed of 133.38 mph.

The Giants thus are a game ahead of both the Los Angeles Dodgers and the defending champion Milwaukee Braves who scored a 4-3 decision over the Cincinnati Reds as Lew Burdette gained his 20th win.

Jones, a 33-year-old sidarmer whose previous single-season high was 17 victories for Wilkes-Barre back in 1950, pitched a four-hitter, struck out six, made two hits himself, scored two runs and contributed a sacrifice that helped to set up another run.

ning homer enabled the Braves to come from behind and run their winning streak to seven games. Don Newcombe carried a 3-2 lead into the eighth inning but a walk and Burdette's forecourt set the stage for Mathews' 37th round-tripper of the year.

Braves Get Slaughter

New York—(UPI)—Enos (Country) Slaughter, the oldest active player in the majors at 43, left the New York Yankees today to help the Milwaukee Braves down the stretch in their battle for the National League pennant.

The Braves acquired the veteran outfielder in a \$20,000 waiver deal yesterday. A Milwaukee spokesman said the left-handed hitting Slaughter would be used chiefly as a pinch hitter.

However, Milwaukee manager Fred Haney announced Friday night he plans to play Slaughter regularly against right-handed pitchers, adding that Enos "probably can do as well as the fellows we've had in left field."

In 77 games with the Yankees last year Slaughter batted .304 but his average was only .172 in 99 times at bat for New York this year.

White Sox Stride Closer To First Pennant in Years

Early Wynn pitched the Chicago White Sox one more stride closer to their first pennant in 40 years Saturday when he hurled them to a 6-1 victory over the Baltimore Orioles and kept their American lead at four games.
