

Ashland Gardeners Apply For National Show Award

Ashland - Ashland Garden club has applied to the Oregon Federation of Garden clubs for a national purple ribbon award for their third standard show, "Oregon, Pacific Wonderland."

The show, held August 28 in Lincoln school, had 181 specimens entered in the horticulture competition and 106

in arrangements. It was considered the largest and most successful show ever held by the club.

Mrs. E. A. Bay was general chairman. Mrs. Ernest Jermak and Mrs. R. D. Lamb were schedule chairmen and Mrs. Richard Westerfield was staging chairman. Club president is Mrs. Clarence Mathis.

Carrying out the Pacific Wonderland theme was a setting depicting an Oregon wilderness with a large stuffed bear and smaller wild animals against a background of evergreen trees, ferns, rocks and logs. A golden eagle perched in a dead snag.

Exhibits ranged in size from an inch-high vase of baby

roses on the Medford Rose society table to a dahlia blossom 14-inches across which was grown by Larkin Grubb, Ashland.

Clarence Lane, who is over 90 years of age, was the oldest exhibitor and 7-year-old Nona Westerfield was youngest. The large non-competitive

division of 63 entries was staged in the corridor of the school. It was augmented by dahlia displays of Mrs. Roscoe Applegate and Ben Hart of Blue Spruce nursery.

Also in the corridor was a display of 15 new roses and five arrangements of Medford Rose society, which was planned by Mr. and Mrs. Randall Axtell, Trail, and Dr. and Mrs. L. G. Gentner, Medford. Mrs. R. D. Lamb won the

sweepstakes award in the horticulture division with eight blue ribbons and Mrs. Bay won the arrangement sweepstakes with three blue ribbons.

Special decorative features at the show included a rock and gem display and a patio which was bordered with potted ferns and small shrubs. Among those who poured were Mrs. A. O. Floyd, Medford, past president of the Oregon Federation, and Mrs. R.

T. Nichol, Siskiyou district director.

A total of 420 signed the guest book. Exhibitors were from Medford, Central Point, Prospect, Shady Cove, Phoenix, Talent, and Ashland. Judged were from Central Point, Medford and Klamath Falls.

The Ashland club will meet Monday, September 14, in the Women's Civic clubhouse, Winburn Way. Mrs. Otto Na-

gel, Eagle Point, will speak on culinary herbs and Mrs. Mathis will conduct the business session.

Loyal Order of the Moose has scheduled a family night for Friday, Sept. 18, at Moose hall.

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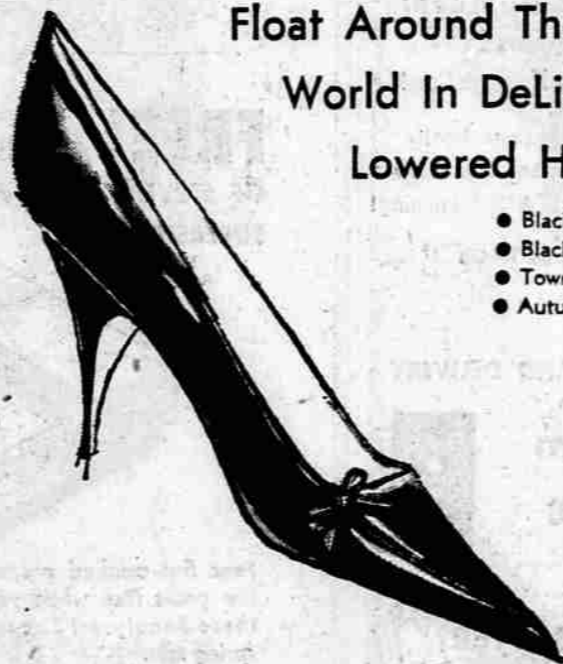
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
