Colored Bricks For Future Houses

Washington—(Science Service)—Future houses and offices may be made of brightly-colored bricks that never need painting.

Harley B. Foster of Greensboro, N.C., was awarded one of 1,007 patents here by the U. S. Patent Office for his methods of changing the natural color of bricks, tile and other ceramics.

In experiments, Foster found that applications of zinc oxide, and small amounts of manganese dioxide, to unfired bricks produced unusual final colors, depending on what other metal was added as a colorant. Addition of copper makes cream, ivory and buff. Cobalt makes blue; chrome makes tan-green; nickel makes silver-gray.

The final color becomes part of the brick physically and chemically and thus resists flaking off under freeze-thaw weather conditions.

His process is based on application of a metallic compound which "marries" iron in the clay, under heat, to form light-colored crystals. As these crystals form, the low-cost pigments diffuse into them to impart the final color.

Superconductivity Nearing Solution

Washington (Science Service)—Why electricity flows almost without resistance in extremely cold metals near absolute zero temperature is close to being understood.

The hitherto baffling phenomenon of superconductivity will be successfully explained by a physically simple theory, Dr. H. W. Lewis, University of Wisconsin, physicist, explained in a communication to the current issue of the journal, Science. This involves what is known as the "energy gap" which means that it takes finite amount of energy to create the lowest excited state of electrons involved in electricity flow. The theory predicts successfully that the energy gap and therefore the superconductivity is largest at absolute zero.

Scientists have long been intrigued by the almost unimpeded flow of electricity at very low temperatures. Some have hoped that superconductivity could be put to work in distribution of electrical energy.

P. I. E. Entries Due Sept. 18

Portland—(UPI)—The planned Pacific International Livestock show scheduled here this fall will not be able to open Oct. 17 if the Centennial Commission removes improvements it has made at the 11-acre site during the last two years, according to a P-I official.

Chairman T. B. Wilcox of the P-I corporation's board of directors said officials so far have failed to come to any agreement in off-the-record negotiating sessions.

Wilcox said most improvements should remain where they are, particularly a sprinkler system around the arena. He said if it was removed the area may be condemned again, as it was in 1952.
