

Northwest Solons Find Soviet Premier Masterful Debater

Washington (special) — In his first full-scale verbal duel with America's top professional politicians on their home grounds, Premier Khrushchev won a rousing triumph for his political savvy.

After the meeting in the Senate Foreign Relations Committee, three Northwest senators expressed these viewpoints.

"No question about the intelligence and ability of this man," said Sen. Wayne Morse (D-Ore.). "He is very effective and a masterful debater. He knows forensic technique. He is clever and fast on his feet."

"He is crafty and adept, possessed of a biting wit and he is a master of evasion," declared Sen. Frank Church (D-Idaho).

"He has a genius for being able to fend off tough questions," noted Sen. Henry M. Jackson (D-Wash.). "He will ask another question in return or establish a premise, false as it is, that relieves him from answering the tough question."

"Of course," added Jackson with a grin, "this is not unknown in American public life."

Time Limited
Morse and Church are members of the Foreign Relations Committee, and Jackson was invited to sit in as a member of the Armed Services Committee. Because the time was limited to 90 minutes, none of the three got to ask any questions.

All the questions were put to Khrushchev by the senior members, which meant that the quizzing on the U.S. side was left to the older politicians for the most part while the younger men waited futilely for their turn. Sen. Mike Mansfield (D-Mont.), for example, didn't get a turn.

nor did Sen. Jack Kennedy (D-Mass.).

Kennedy and Sen. Lyndon B. Johnson (D-Tex.) were the only presidential prospects in the senatorial gathering. Sens. Hubert Humphrey (D-Minn.), who had a long debate with the Soviet boss last fall in Moscow, was absent, as was Sen. Stuart Symington (D-Mo.).

Morse said Khrushchev had the ability and preparation of a good lawyer who not only knows his own case but the other side's case as well. He said he never missed an opportunity to rap an adversary. For example, when a senator, identified by Sen. William Fulbright as Sen. Everett Dirksen (R-Ill.), asked about travel restrictions in Russia.

Films Shown Church Teachers, Officers

for Americans, he said there were no such restrictions in America.

Would Trade Miles
"I'll give you two miles in the Soviet Union for every mile we can go in the United States," the Russian was quoted as telling Dirksen, pointing out correctly that the U.S. has substantial limits on Soviet travels here.

When Fulbright asked him how did he reconcile Tibet, Korea and Laos with his talk of peaceful co-existence, Khrushchev ducked the question by saying he had made an agreement with President Eisenhower — not to discuss problems concerning third countries but to stick to problems strictly between the U.S. and Russia. Since senators hadn't heard of any such agreement, they were thereby precluded from challenging its authenticity or getting in any tough questions.

Referring then to Red China, Khrushchev reportedly told Fulbright: "You know where China is on the map. It's a big country. You could find it. Why don't you go talk to the leaders of that country. I'm no emissary for them."

Autograph Promises
Morse noted that one evidence of Khrushchev's psychological impact on the senators was that after the meeting was concluded, senator after senator went up to the Soviet leader to try to get his autograph on their place cards. The autograph requests were so numerous that the Soviet ambassador at length gathered up the cards and promised to have them autographed and returned later in order to have time.

"Talk about a selling job," declared Morse. "I think it was good for us all to see how able this man is and how well informed. It demonstrated how sound was my position in insisting that there be some meeting between him and members of Congress."

Morse prevented Congress from adjourning until the day Mr. K arrived.

Queen Closes Parliament

London — UP — Queen Elizabeth formally dissolved Parliament today, and most members of the House of Commons headed for their home districts to campaign for the Oct. 8 election.

The Queen returned from her Scottish castle at Balmoral to reside at a meeting of the Privy Council and issue a proclamation ending the 4½-year life of the present Legislature.

The proclamation was read in the Houses of Lords and Commons by the Lord Chamberlain. The Queen herself did

not appear in either house.

The Chamberlain also sent county officials the notification that an election is scheduled Oct. 8 which formally marked the opening of the campaign.

Party organizations, which have been hard at work since the coming election was announced by Prime Minister Harold Macmillan, were ready to prime their candidates with pamphlets and prefabricated speeches.

The winners will assemble here Oct. 20 for the swearing-in of the new Parliament.

Well Driller Killed Near Klamath Falls

Klamath Falls — UP — George Hartley, about 60, a well-drilling contractor, was killed instantly Thursday afternoon when a chain broke and struck him while he was putting down a well in the Sportsman's Park development on upper Klamath Lake about 24 miles northwest of here.

Hartley was standing under the rigging and pulling up machinery from the casing in the well when the chain snapped and struck him across the head.

First Mass to be Read in Church

Ashland — Services will be held for the first time today in the new church of Our Lady of the Mountain Catholic church, 987 Hillview dr., Ashland.

Masses will be held at 8 a.m. and 11:15 a.m. with the children's choir singing at the early service and the adult choir at the 11:15 a.m. mass.

The new church, of semi-modern design, is of California redwood exterior and will seat 300 persons. The interior is of prefabricated mahogany panels and the major portion of the interior appointments

were donated by parishioners, according to the Rev. William S. Walsh, priest of the church.

The new California red oak pews were handmade by the Trappist monks of Lafayette, Ore., it was reported.

Formal dedication of the building will be announced. Completed are the church and rectory with the interior of the parish hall yet to be done, according to Father Walsh.
