'Growers Group' Forms**

Cave Junction - A new "Grower Group" of Illinois valley men and women organized last week, with Clyde Broeffle selected chairman, Fran Day vice chairman, and Mrs. Clyde Broeffle secretary and treasurer.

The group organized in the interests of testing the soil on farms, sending the tests to the county agent, Marvin Young, and having it analyzed with regard to what it lacks and what can be added to it to bring it into full production. Young will send the tests to Corvallis and in turn they will make recommendations.

If enough growers join the group and determine what to raise, plans will be drawn up and studied as to the feasibility of having a processing center and plant in the Illinois valley.

Cartons and information sheets for soil testing can be obtained at the county agent's office in Grants Pass or from Walter Eichler at the high school.

FFA boys will take the samples for the growers if they desire.

Marvin Young, county agent, will speak at a meeting at the Voag building at the high school, September 22 at 8 p.m.

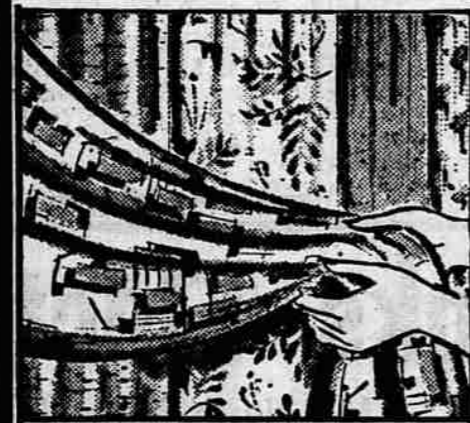

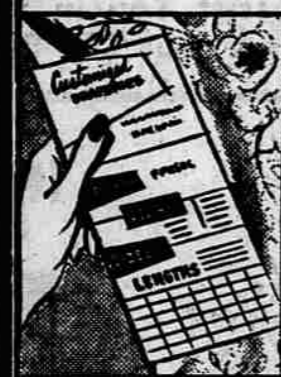

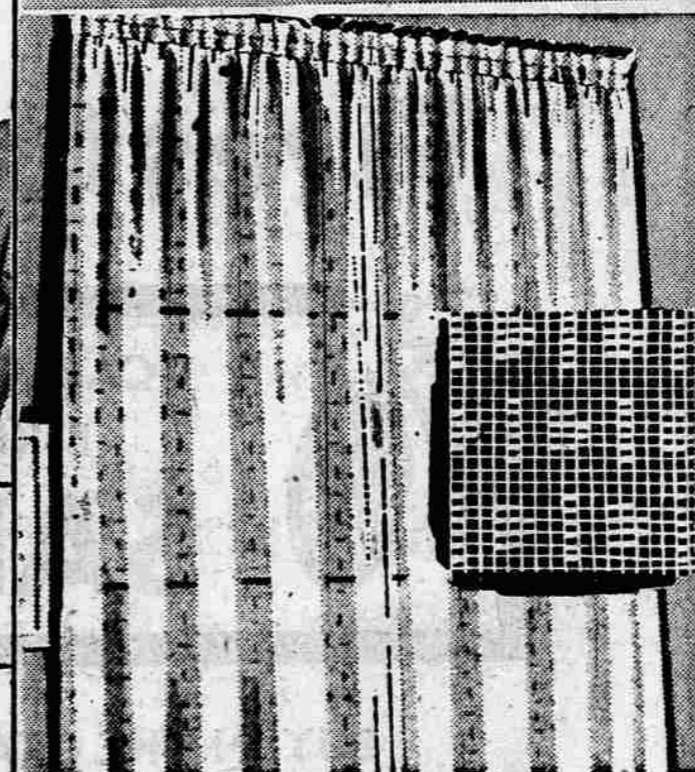
