no charge.

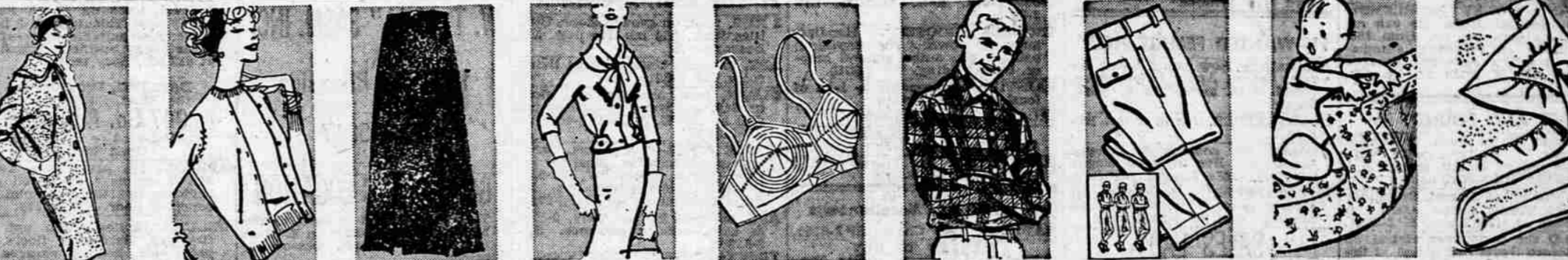
**Grant for Portland**

**Sewage Plant OK'd**

Portland (UPI)—Final author-  
ization for a \$250,000 federal  
grant to aid in the construc-  
tion of the Fanno Creek inter-  
ceptor and sewage treatment  
plant in Portland's southwest  
hills was issued Thursday by  
the State Sanitary Authority.

The approval is expected  
to pave the way for early  
construction of the initial  
phase of the three-county sew-  
age disposal system. The  
measure, expected to cost  
about \$27,500,000, is designed  
to serve close to 1,174,000 per-  
sons in Multnomah, Washing-  
ton and Clackamas counties.
