Method Predicts Radio Reception

Boulder, Colo. (Science Service) — A way of predicting whether a radio station at one point is likely to be heard 500 miles away at another point on a winter afternoon has been developed by the National Bureau of Standards.

Accurate advance estimates of probable radio transmission losses are essential to the design, location and frequencies assigned to commercial and military communications stations, and broadcasting and navigational installations.

The technique applies to radio transmission losses at frequencies above 10 megacycles per second over paths of various lengths.

The new method, developed here at the Bureau's Boulder Laboratories by P. L. Rice, A. G. Longley and K. A. Norton, puts into the calculations such things as lay-of-the-land, and weather. Calculations can be converted to estimates for times other than "winter afternoons."

Technical details are carried in National Bureau of Standards Technical Note 15.
