GP Teacher on Science Caravan

Among the 16 high school science teachers who will leave Eugene Sept. 28 with the University of Oregon's caravan of traveling science demonstration lectures will be a Grants Pass High school biology teacher.

The teacher, Leslie J. Weltgart of Rogue River, will cover southern Oregon.

The program, supported by a National Science Foundation grant, will cover secondary schools in the six northwest states. They will work with science teachers in developing improved teaching methods in the science classes.

During the first week each teacher with an apparatus-equipped station wagon will travel through the territory for which each is responsible.
