Jack Fleck Shares Tie

San Francisco - (UP) - The pickings have been lean for Jack Fleck the last three years.

Since Fleck astonished the golfing world by defeating "unbeatable" Ben Hogan in a play-off of the National Open championship in this city in 1955, he hasn't won a single tournament.

In fact, he hasn't even come close.

But today, as the second round of the \$40,000 Golden Gate Open tournament got under way Fleck was tied for the leadership with rookie tourist Mason Rudolph of Clarksville, Tenn., after firing four-under-par 67s.

Fleck, labeled a "Cheese champion" by some after he captured the Open, didn't become a full time tourist until this year. He won \$4000 during January without capturing a tournament, then tailed off to rake in only \$4,800 during the next eight months.

Even with their fine shot-making, Fleck and Rudolph didn't have much of an advantage on the field. Of the 154 starters, only 24 broke par. Dick Souchak, Gross, M. Y., and Frank Strangis, Toledo, Ohio, were real close with 68s.

Lion Hopes On Rookies This Year

Detroit - (UP) - Coach George Wilson is counting heavily on a trio of rookies to aid the Detroit Lions in a comeback attempt this season.

Wilson directed the Lions to the National Football League title in 1957—his freshman year as head coach—but watched the team slip to fifth place in the Western Division last year.

He is pinning his hopes for a strong comeback on fullback Nick Pietrosante of Notre Dame and guards Mike Rabold of Indiana and Bob Grottkau of Oregon.

Pietrosante was Detroit's No. 1 draft choice last fall and is battling John Henry Johnson for the starting job at fullback.

"Johnson is still our first string fullback," Wilson said. "But we've finally got a good man to back him up."

Wilson has been impressed with Pietrosante's running and also with his bruising blocks.

3rd at Guard
Rabold and Grottkau are bidding for the right guard spot on the offensive unit.

The offensive line was the key to Detroit's downfall a year ago, according to Wilson.

"I'm sure Rabold and Grottkau are going to help us, and we've also got John Gordy back to bolster the offensive line," Wilson pointed out.

Gordy was a key man in Detroit's drive to the league championship in 1957 but he sat out the 1958 campaign while serving as an assistant coach at Nebraska.

Wilson is using Gordy at left tackle on the offensive line. Ollie Spencer is at right tackle. Harley Sewell at left guard and Charley Ane at center.

Two top pass catchers - Jerry Reichow and Steve Junker - sat out the entire 1958 season with injuries suffered in the pre-season exhibition schedule.

Reichow and Junker are back in action and Wilson also has veteran receivers Jim Doran and Dave Middleton on hand.

Defense has shown good improvement but the offense has had some rough spots to polish as the McLoughlin Junior high ninth grade football team has prepped for its season opener.

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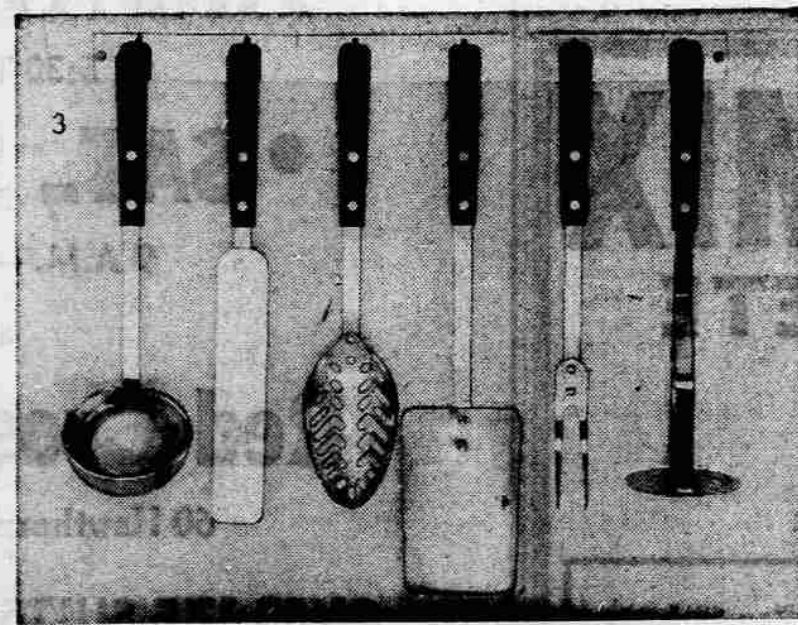
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
