## Communist China Nears Tenth Anniversary With Confidence

Toyko—UPI—A decade ago, Mao Tse-tung, chief architect of the Chinese Communist revolution, declared triumphantly: "The Chinese people, one quarter of the human race, have now stood up."  
His words were confident and defiant, despite the fact that his nation lay in ruins after 22 straight years of war and civil strife.

Next Thursday Communist China celebrates its 10th birthday, more confident, more defiant and more dangerous than ever.

In Peiping's enormous Tienanmen "square of heavenly peace" hundreds of thousands of spectators will look to a raised platform set amid gaudy pennants and banners where the men who made the revolution will be standing.

**Men in Spotlight**  
Here are some of the men who are almost certain to be in the spotlight on Oct. 1:

—Mao Tse-tung, 65, chairman of the Communist Party, guiding spirit of the revolution and himself a living myth. The moonfaced son of a Hunan farmer, Mao retired as president of the government last April, but he remains unchallenged as the top man in China.

—Liu Shao-chi, 54, or 61, Mao's dour first lieutenant, the new president of the government and a bit of a mystery man, whose age is not even known for certain. This tough, Moscow-trained administrator now stands as Mao's heir-apparent.

—Chou En-lai, 61, the nimble premier, a suave, handsome man who somehow has managed to land on his feet through three decades of shifts and purges and even now may be working his way out from under a cloud.

**Plotted in 1920**  
These are the men who swept one-fourth of mankind into the Communist camp. They are the first generation of Chinese Communism, the men who began plotting back in the 1920s in Shanghai and Paris and are still around today, holding the reins.

A decade ago they were gaunt from years of retreat and defeat, of guerrilla warfare and the austere life of the caves of Yen'an where they fled from Shanghai in the "long march" of the 1920s. They were probably also a bit amazed at their sudden success.

In 1947, Chiang Kai-shek's Nationalist armies had the Communists on the run. As soon as the civil war resumed at the end of World War II the Reds were routed from

urban strongholds and appeared headed for defeat.

But up in Manchuria, the industrial heart of China, a slender young general named Lin Piao, not yet 40 years old, was whipping a powerful Communist army into shape. It was armed with almost unlimited guns and ammunition captured from the Japanese by the Russians and given to the Chinese Reds.

on the rural regions of Manchuria and was ready to reach for the cities. Once he began moving he never stopped. Lin turned the tide for the Communists.

This is the same Lin now 51, who became China's new defense minister a week ago. He is almost certain to be on the reviewing stand next Thursday, for he ranks sixth in the Communist hierarchy and is considered one of the men to watch in Red China.

Lin's 4th field army broke the Nationalists' back. With all Manchuria under their control the Communists swept into Peiping and Tientsin and quickly took over the rest of the country. On Oct. 1, 1949, Mao proclaimed the founding of "the people's republic of China."
