

Italy, in Fine Shape Militarily, Has Economic and Political Difficulties

Rome - (UPI) - Premier Antonio Regni arrives in the United States Sept. 30 to confer with Representative of an Italy more powerful than at any time since World War II. But it is an Italy with its troubles - economic and political. Economically, there is unemployment. Politically, there is a complex of parties from the extreme left to the extreme right, each with its own axe to grind.

But militarily, Italy is in fine shape. Segni has behind him an army of more than 500,000 men - smaller but more powerful than the Italian forces at the time Benito Mussolini threw his Fascist legions into World War II. Due IRBM Missiles

In addition, there are 5,500 American troops stationed in Italy and the country soon will receive 30 Jupiter IRBM missiles.

Italy has come a long way since 1952 when an American journalist claimed the Italian link in the Allied defense chain was "made of spaghetti."

The country, one of the most pro-American nations in Europe, has tried to fulfill its commitments in the Western defense plan. It has the added incentive of being on the border of Yugoslavia and right across the sea from Communist Albania.

Besides its modern army, Italy has some 100 vessels - most of them small - and five fighter air commands, one reconnaissance wing, one transport command and two anti-submarine commands.

Improving Prestige

Since Segni took over as premier early this year, he has turned a good deal of his attention to improving Italy's prestige and authority in the Western camp. The country has long felt it has fully recovered from World War II and should be given an equal voice with some of the other European nations, such as Germany and even France.

During the recent foreign ministers conference, both Segni and Foreign Minister Giuseppe Pella consulted many times with American and other Western officials at Geneva, putting forth the Italian views. In addition, Secretary of State Christian Herter and other U.S. leaders paid visits to Rome during the meeting.

Statistics on Italy's industrial progress show why the country is flexing its muscles. Its industrial output is

double the pre-war level. The merchant fleet, 90 per cent destroyed by the war, has been rebuilt and is back on the seas as a world leader. The chronic foreign trade deficit has been overcome, at least temporarily.

In addition, extensive reforms have been carried out, including a land reform - long Segni's pet political project - that gave land to 100,000 peasant families.

But there still are a number of problems to solve.

Many Unskilled Jobs

One of the biggest is unemployment. There are nearly two million unemployed, virtually all of them unskilled workers who can hardly find a job unless they first get some training.

Another is the Communists. They have lost power since 1948 when they were on the verge of taking over at the polls, but they still are the largest Communist party outside of the Iron Curtain bloc.

Keeping what is known as "Italy" from falling apart at the seams is a problem that is getting worse by the moment. Italy includes the autonomous regions of Sicily, the German-speaking region of Alto Adige and the French-aligned region of Valle D'osta.

More Freedom Wanted

Each region has its local government and local traditions, culture and language. They want more freedom from the Rome government and the Communists have been quick to step in and

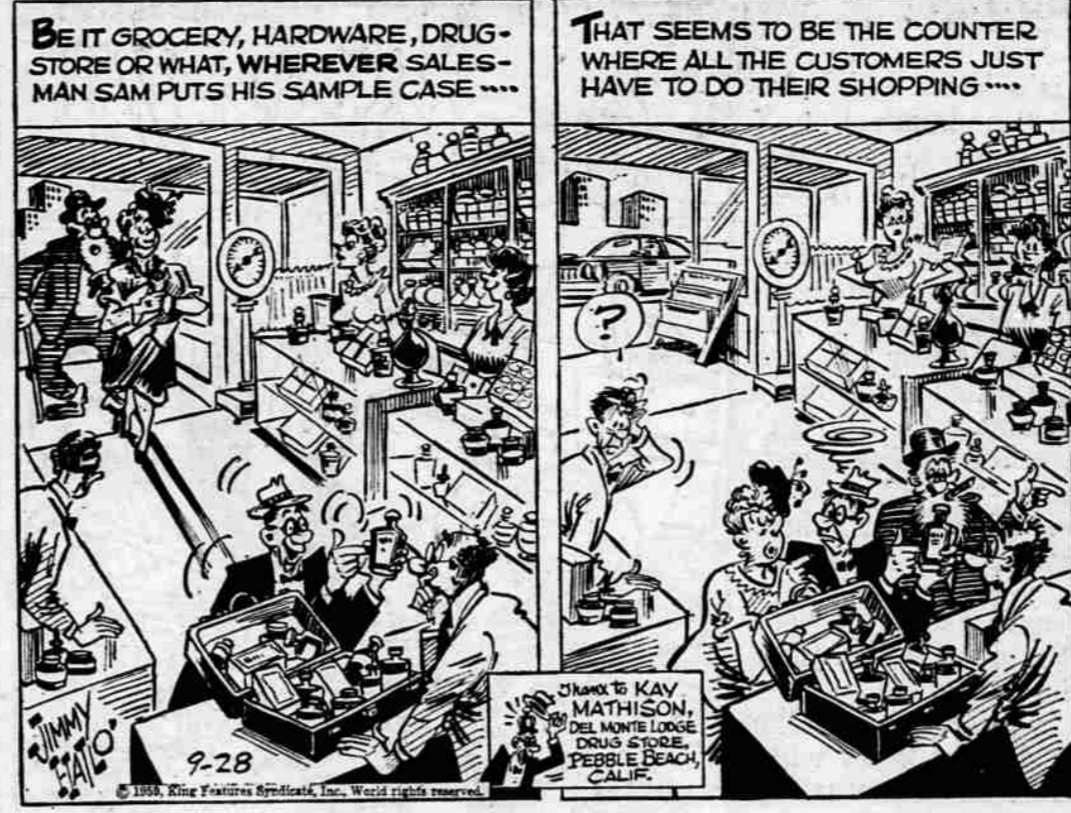
