Hurricane Moves Toward Florida

Miami - (UPI) - Hurricane Gracie moved ominously toward the northeast Florida coast early today packing winds up to 90 miles an hour.

The Miami Weather Bureau reported that the week-old hurricane was located in the Atlantic about 300 miles east of Cape Canaveral, Fla. and moving west-northwest at about seven miles an hour.

The bureau said this course and speed for the next 12 hours would bring Gracie's 40-mile-an-hour outward winds to within 75 to 100 miles of the northeast Florida, Georgia, and Carolinas coasts by this afternoon.

Ed Dully, director of Red Cross disaster services for the southeast, said he had ordered nine field workers from the Atlanta office to augment personnel standing by at Brunswick and Savannah, Ga. and Jacksonville, Orlando and Cocoa, Fla.

Brothers Found Safe in Woods

Goble - (UPI) - Two brothers who were missing for several hours were found safe at 1 a.m. today in woods seven miles west of here.

The lads, Jimmy Budge, 14, and his brother, Henry, 10, went fishing at Tide creek about 1 p.m. Sunday. When they failed to return a search party was formed.

Volunteers and sheriff's officers found the boys when their shouts awakened them.

The boys had gone to sleep beside an old church in Shiloah Basin after darkness overtook them. They had planned to walk home after daylight.

Two Missing in Ship Collision

Seattle - (UPI) - Two men were missing and presumed drowned today following the ramming of the fishing vessel Jans, of Seattle, at the entrance of the Strait of Juan De Fuca by the merchant ship Mormacine in heavy fog Sunday.

The Coast Guard reported three men from the 56-foot fishing boat were rescued by the Mormacine, a 439-foot vessel owned by Moore-McCormack Lines Inc. Missing and believed drowned were Harold Toft, 38, Seattle, the skipper, and P. B. Jorgensen, about 33, also of Seattle.

Rescued were Darwin Hoe, 62, Seattle, the vessel's cook; Harold E. Hansen, 55, Seattle, and Alfred Horn, 52, Blaine, Wash.

The Coast Guard said the search for Toft and Jorgensen was called off after eight hours when no trace of them could be found.

The collision occurred about 8 a.m. Sunday four miles northeast of Tatoosh Island, off the extreme northwestern tip of Washington state.

Wall Street Chatter

New York - (UPI) - Styles in speculation, as in clothes, change constantly and the emphasis now is on reality rather than fantasy, says Sidney B. Lurie of Josephthal & Co.

The market's "soberer" environment might make the once-bitten speculator twice as shy today, he points out.

"Time, and a healthy price adjustment, have taken care of many problems in a market which doesn't move in unison," he adds. It is probably true, he notes, that the average-wise lows have been recorded for the balance of the year and that there are many individual candidates for new 1959 highs.

Hemphill, Noyes & Co. says aluminum shares have been able to command a good market following this year stemming in large measure from new uses which are developing. Revere Copper & Brass appears to be one of the best ways to invest in the future of this dynamic industry, it adds.

Walston & Co. says General Tire's net for 1959 is expected to be more than double last year's \$2.06 a share. Motorola also looks for a record 1959 net, it notes.

New York - (UPI) - Casey Stengel will have to pay his way into the World Series this week but he isn't going to be made to pay for the collapse of the New York Yankees.

General Manager George Weiss, wishing to "put to rest all reports about Stengel not being back next year," issued a formal statement Sunday which stated the Yankees had "no thought" of replacing him as manager.

Red China To Curb Shelling of Quemoy

Tokyo - (UPI) - Communist China today announced a five-day respite from shelling Nationalist China's offshore island of Quemoy.

Radio Peiping said Red guns would be silent Sept. 29 and Oct. 1 in honor of the 10th anniversary of the Red Chinese government.

The Reds normally shell on odd-numbered days and do not shell on even-numbered days of the month.

Benny's Maxwell To Run in Race

Hollywood - (UPI) - An argument between a restaurateur and a Wisconsin publisher over the merits of old cars has led to a slowdown race next Thursday between Jack Benny's Maxwell and a 1909 FWD Battleship.

Benny's notoriously underpaid valet, Rochester (Eddie Anderson) will pilot the Maxwell against the Battleship, which was built in Clintonville, Wis., and will be driven by Joe Leyrer, Clintonville.

Restaurant man Bob Cobb is backing the Maxwell. Walter Gleason, publisher of the Tribune-Gazette, is backing the race which will range from Los Angeles Griffith park area into Hollywood and wind up at the Brown Derby.

Both cars are reported to have a top speed of 27 miles per hour. Cobb and Gleason have a bet-50 cents-on-the outcome.
