Centennial Asked To Pay for Police

Portland—(UPI)—The Oregon Centennial Commission has been asked by Multnomah county to pay \$44,256 for police traffic work during the Centennial Exposition at the North Portland grounds last summer. But the county might not get the money.

Multnomah county commissioners said that Centennial officials agreed orally to pay the tab. At the same time, H. Quentin Cox, Centennial director, said there was no such agreement and that policing of traffic was the county's responsibility.

One county commissioner, Mike Gleason, said he knew of no action that could be taken to force payment.

Prize Cockers To Be 'De-Barked'

Long Stratton, Eng. — (UPI) — Miss Mary Helen Grace said Tuesday she would submit her prize-winning Cocker Spaniels to a "de-barking" operation rather than give them up.

Miss Grace, who raises cockers, was fined five pounds (\$14) after three neighbors complained the dogs were making too much noise.

Miss Grace had pleaded innocent but she was fined anyway and the judge reminded her she was liable to a penalty of two pounds a day while the barking continued.

Miss Grace said she had consulted a veterinary surgeon who told her about a new operation for "de-barking" dogs.

'Tough' Policy on Reckless Drivers

Salem—(UPI)—A "get tough" policy for dealing with teenage reckless drivers is possible even though the new state juvenile code says that traffic charges against teenagers must be filed in juvenile courts first, Attorney General Robert Y. Thornton said today.

Once the charges are filed in juvenile court, the judge can transfer the case to another proper court such as District, Justice or Municipal Court where the offender could get stiffer penalties, Thornton noted.

He said that some district attorneys were following this practice.

Thornton Warns on Credit 'Gimmick'

Salem—(UPI)—Federal postal authorities today were alerted by Attorney General Robert Y. Thornton to watch for revival of a "gimmick" whereby "unethical" credit agencies seek to trace debtors who move.

An official-looking punched card that purports to be a request for information by the Unemployment Compensation Commission is mailed from Washington, D.C. to Oregon addresses, Thornton said.

It has a Salem post office box return address. The addressee is given the impression that if he does not fill out and return the card he may be liable to fine or imprisonment.

Thornton warned postal inspectors in Portland inasmuch as the state has no statute covering this specific practice.

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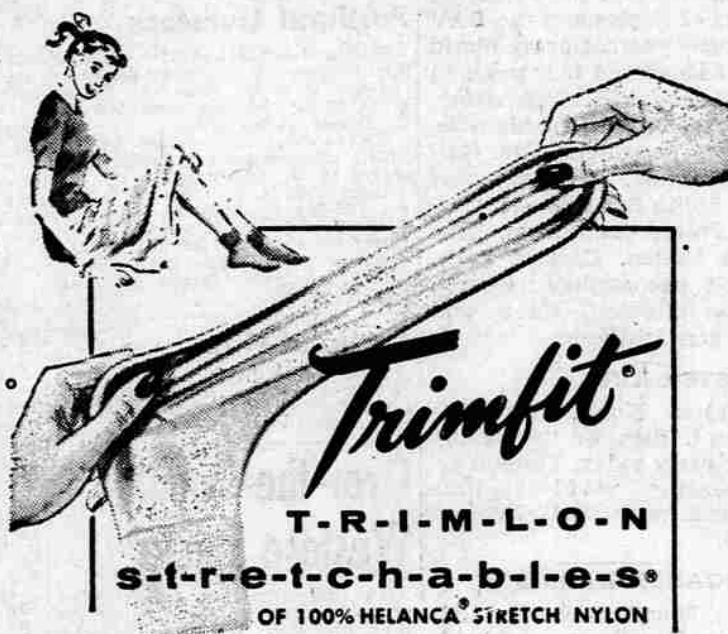
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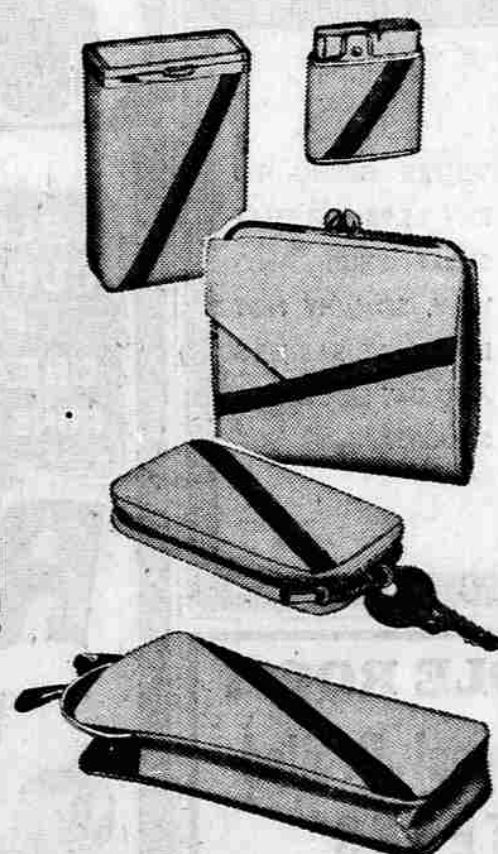
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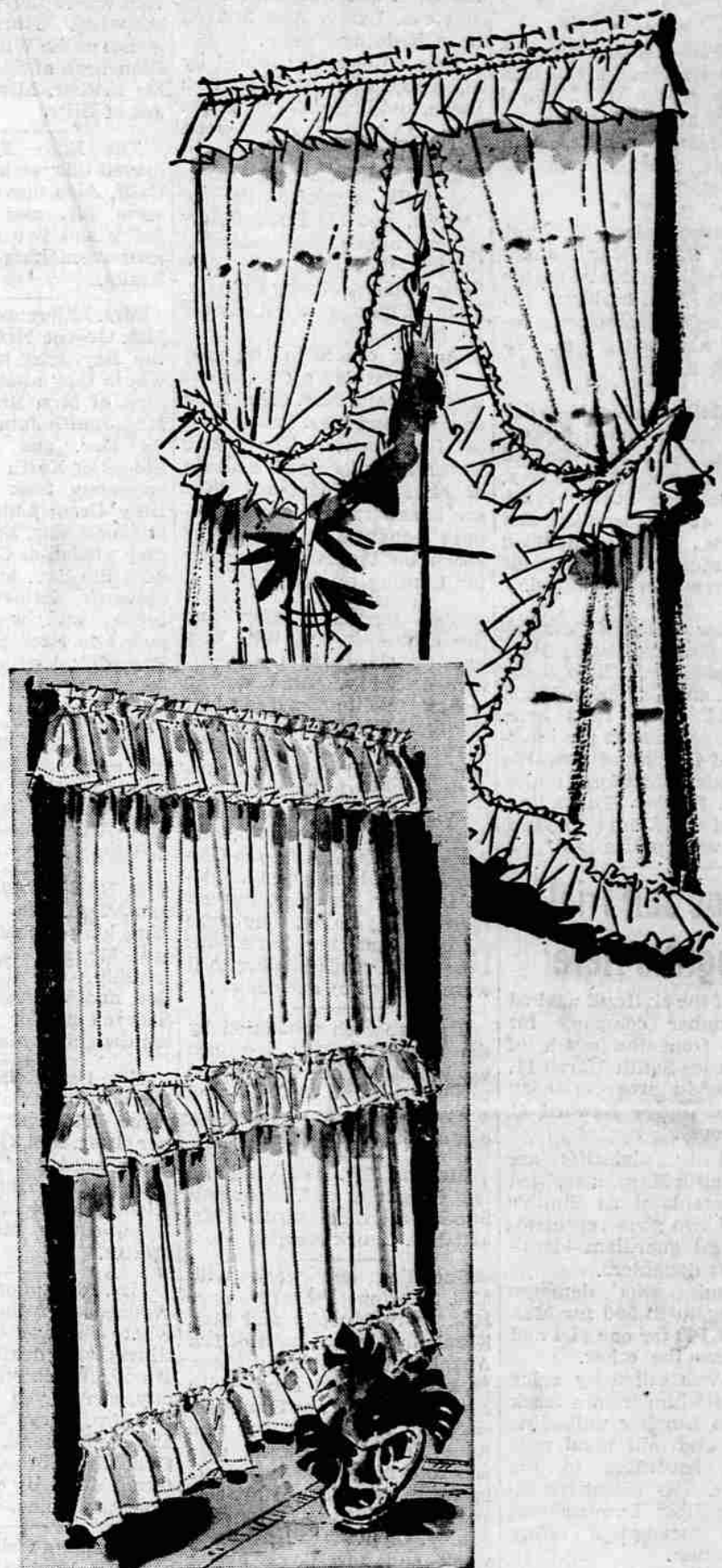
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
