

Dodgers Say Team Not on Ropes After 11-0 Triumph by Chisox

 Chicago—(UPI)—The Chicago

White Sox, off to a flying start in their drive to make up for the biggest blot on baseball's record, tried to make it two in a row over the deflated Los Angeles Dodgers today in the second game of the World Series.
 Manager Al Lopez called on Bob Shaw, an 18-game winner, to aid the White Sox' campaign to erase the memory of how their last pennant-winner—the "Black Sox" of 40 years ago—threw the 1919 series to the Cincinnati Reds. Shaw, a fast-balling right-hander, was to face southpaw Johnny Podres, who hurled the Dodgers to their only World Series triumph—back in 1955 when they were based in Brooklyn. Podres has a 14-9 record against Shaw's 18-6.

Early Wynn, a 39-year-old veteran who bounced back to win 22 games this season, and heavily-muscled Ted Kluszewski, with two home runs and five runs batted in, were the chief heroes as the White Sox shut out the Dodgers 11-0 and rocked them back on their heels with an 11-hit attack which made it the worst first game runaway in Series annals.
 Comeback Noted
 But the Dodgers insisted that they weren't hanging on the ropes, pointing out that they had come back from a 12-2 loss to the Chicago Cubs to win the National league

on to second. Wynn contributed to his own cause next with a double to center, scoring Rivera. But the next two men went down to finally end it.
 The game assumed comic opera proportions as the Sox added two more in the fourth. Landis started with his third straight single and then it was Big Klu again—smashing a homer against the upper rail in right field. As the ball dropped back on the playing field, Dodger right fielder picked it up in disgust and hurled it up into the roaring crowd.
 That Kluszewski blast ended the scoring for the day, and, while it was five runs batted in to equal the World Series one-game mark held jointly by Yankees Tony Lazzeri and Bill Dickey, it also was more than the White Sox were to need on this actual anniversary of the day 40 years ago when they started their sordid trip into shame and infamy.

Kluszewski Tells His Impression

 Chicago—(UPI)—That wasn't too bad for a start, but what do I do now for an encore?
 When you've been around the majors as long as I have, you don't feel there are many thrills left in store for you. This was by far my biggest one, though.
 Here am I, a guy who has spent practically my entire career in the National league and never dreamed—not until a week ago, anyway—of ever getting in a World Series anymore.

And to start it off like this—well, sir, I don't think I can ever top it.
 I didn't think that first homer of mine was going all the way in the third inning. I thought it was going to come down short. There wasn't any question in my mind about the second one, though. I knew that was gone for good. Happy? Didn't you notice how I hot-dogged it around the bases after that fourth inning homer. Boy, I was really in clover trotting around those bases.
 The thing that really pleased me was that my wife was out to the park and practically the whole town of Argo. What do you mean you never heard of Argo? It has a population of 10,000 and it happens to be right here in Illinois. It also happens to be my hometown.

Apart from my hitting, I felt good because I finally got a uniform tailored with the sleeves cut short—just like I used to wear when I was with Cincinnati and Pittsburgh.
 The White Sox didn't have a uniform like that when I came over to them from the Pirates last August 25th. They got me one for the World Series, though.
 Am I going to wear the same one today? Are you kidding?

Duke Snider Could Be Series Goat

Chicago—(UPI)—Will Duke Snider, hero of many a World Series for the Dodgers, become the "goat" of the current Series with the Chicago White Sox?
 Snider appeared to have a good start for the goat's role. The veteran outfielder equalled a Series record by committing two errors in one inning—the big third when the White Sox scored seven runs in their 11-0 rout of the Dodgers.
 But the Duke, who has appeared in five previous classics, also has Series records for most home runs by a National league player (10), and runs batted in (24).
 Not Worried
 He wasn't worried about becoming the goat, and neither was manager Walt Alston.
 "That was only one game and I can tell you how it happened," said the Duke, sipping a bottle of beer after the game.
 Snider spoke of his first error in the third inning, when left fielder Wally Moon and he collided on Sherm Lollar's easy fly ball in left center.
 "I called for the ball. I didn't know Moon was coming in for the catch. I heard the people shouting that we were going to bump, but it was too late. The ball bounced out of my hand," Snider said.
 On the second error, I threw to second. Nobody was there," he said.

World Series Record for One Game Foreseen

Los Angeles—(UPI)—An all-time record for a single World Series game appeared a certainty today—no matter what happens to the Dodgers in the second game with the Chicago White Sox.
 Dodger officials said every one of the 92,000 Coliseum seats have been sold for the three Series games here, starting Sunday. Many fans stood in line all night to be ready for the sale of 30,000 tickets Thursday.
 Business Manager Harold Parrott said the exact total would be slightly more than 92,000 although no exact figure is available. The Coliseum has a total seating capacity of more than 100,000 for football, but several thousand seats are exempted when the huge saucer is cleared for baseball.

Portland State To Battle OTI

Sportswriters Divide in Poll

Chicago—(UPI)—The nation's sportswriters split right down the middle in their choice of the Chicago White Sox or Los Angeles Dodgers to win the World Series, a United Press International poll showed today.
 The poll, a sampling taken of 95 writers, had 48 backing the Sox and 47 for the Dodgers.
 Only one writer, however, Paul Horowitz of the Newark, N. J., Evening News, felt the Series' would end in four games. Horowitz picked the Sox.
 Heart of the Dodgers' support came from, as expected, West Coast newsmen, though a large part also came from Easterners who said the Dodgers by any other name still looked like Brooklyn.
 Midwesterners backed the Sox heavily, though both Dodger and Sox supporters strongly insisted emotions had nothing to do with their choices which they protested were guided solely by "cold facts."
 By far the majority of those queried felt the Series would go five or six games. Six writers said it would go seven, with the six evenly divided between the Dodgers and Sox.

Gomes Picked Over Fullmer

Providence, R. I.—(UPI)—World junior lightweight champion Harold Gomes of Providence is a heavy favorite over Jay Fullmer in tonight's 10-round nationally-televised bout at Rhode Island Auditorium.
 Ring observers feel that the 26-year-old Gomes is more experienced, is a better puncher and has more stamina than Fullmer, of West Jordan, Utah.
 Fullmer, the brother of newly-crowned World Middleweight Champion Gene Fullmer, has had 19 professional fights and has won 17 of them. Gomes' title will not be at stake.

Webfoots Entertain Washington Staters

Eugene—(UPI)—A dry field was forecast today for Saturday's Oregon-Washington State game at Hayward field.
 Oregon will be after its third straight victory of the young season against the Cougars, a team they meet again this year at Pullman.
 Coach Len Casanova warned his Webfoots that WSC has the capacity to take advantage of any break. He said the game would be one of Oregon's toughest this season.
 Last year Washington State blanked Oregon 6-0 at Hayward field.
 Oregon holds 28-27 and 21-6 wins over Stanford and Utah respectively. WSU lost to California 20-6 and defeated San Jose State 30-6.
