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### Three Appear in Circuit Court

The imposition of sentence on James Earl Quates, 23, of Georgiana, Ala., was suspended for two years. Quates, who had pleaded guilty July 16 to a charge of burglary not in a dwelling, was placed on probation for the two-year period.
