Detroit - Chrysler Corp. is expected to be back in full swing on production of 1960 models by mid-week.

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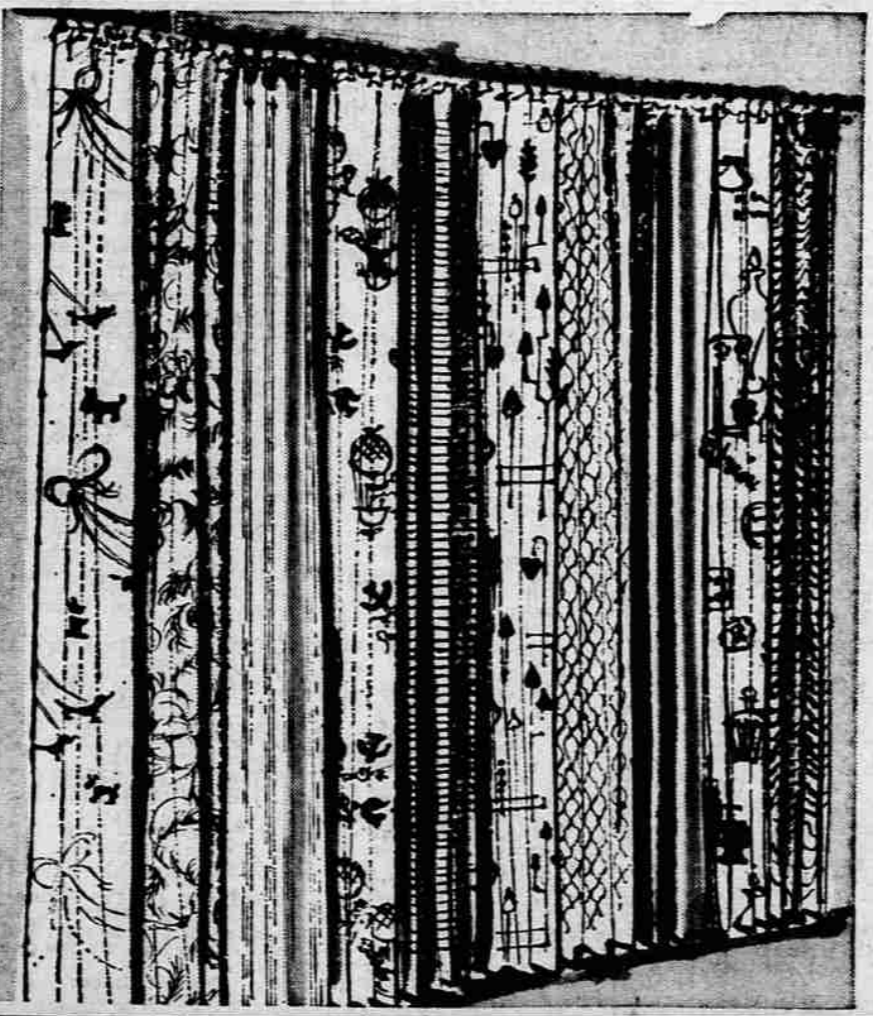
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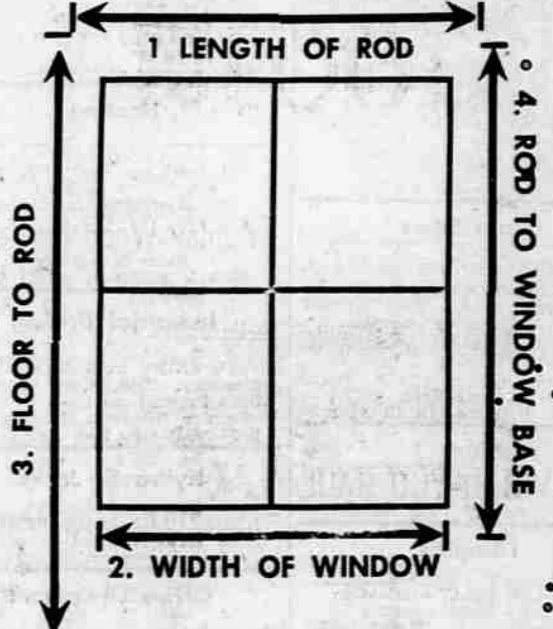


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
