Timer Retires

Jerry Jerome Retires From Timer Position

E. C. (Jerry) Jerome, timekeeper at Medford high home football games for 40 years, has retired from that duty.

Jerome said yesterday, "I'm just going to sit up in the grandstand and enjoy the games."

The longtime timekeeper began his service in 1919 and ended it following the Orland game this year. There have been 12 head football coaches at Medford high during his tenure.

In 1943 Jerome received a letterman's sweater with 25 stripes on the sleeve, indicating his 25th season as timekeeper. Later stripes have been added to the right sleeve.

Just before retirement from business, Jerome was with radio station KMED. He once had the Texas company gasoline agency here. He was in the tire business at one time and was an assistant manager for Standard Oil company.

After first coming here, Jerome worked for Prospect Contracting company, which built the first dam on Rogue river and then was associated with Condon Light and Power company which became California Oregon Power company.

Jerome still has the watch and gun he used as timer back in 1919. For many years, he performed his duties right on the field. In later years he operated the clock from the press box.

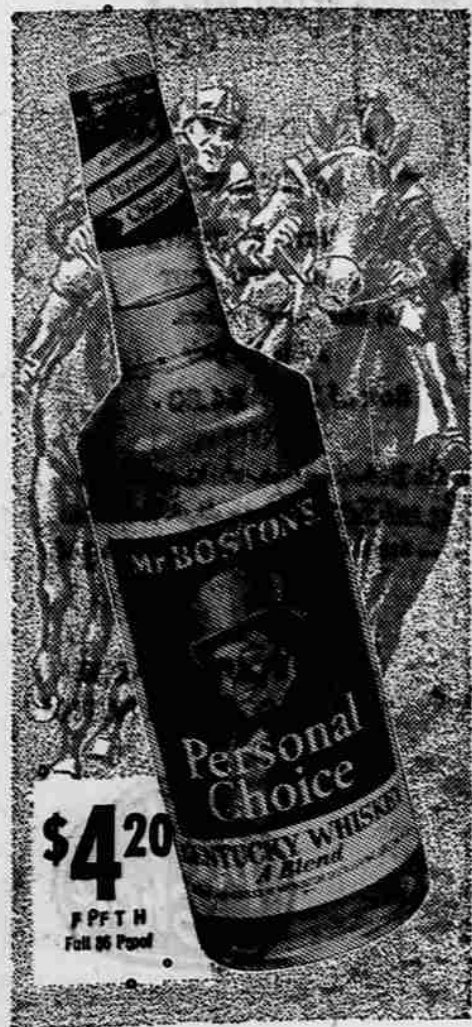
