The Family Council

Editor's note: The Family Council consists of a judge, a psychiatrist, three clergymen, a newspaper editor, a woman's editor and two writers. Each article is a summary of an actual report. The Family Council does not give advice; it merely reports on problems that have been dealt with by responsible agencies and counselors.

Mrs. M. H.—He's just stringing her along.
Dora H.—I just know he'll marry me.

Mrs. M. H.—I am very much worried about my 22-year-old daughter, Dora, who has been going out with the same fellow for two years. She doesn't see anybody else, yet I don't hear any talk about marriage.

This boy is serving an apprenticeship and won't have a real job for another year and a half. His uncle owns a skating rink and he takes Dora there all the time. When she suggests a movie he always talks her out of it. He has never given her a gift in all this time.

I feel she is wasting her time with him. He's just stringing her along. When he gets a job, he will throw her over and find somebody else. I feel she should tell him off or else find herself another beau. It doesn't do to make a doormat of yourself.

Dora H.—Mother never liked Jerry and told me so from the beginning. She's just against him and anything he does is wrong. I happen to love him and I'd wait for him another five years if I had to.

I feel that I'm still young enough to wait another two years anyway. In the meantime I'm working and saving money so we'll be off to a good start. I know Jerry will marry me. He doesn't see any other girl and he always tells me that he never used to enjoy going out with girls until he met me.

I hate it when mother talks about gifts and how much money he spends on me. I don't think things like that matter. Some girls are just out for what they can get from a man. I have never been like that. I would much rather be married to a poor man who really loves me. My mother is all wrong.

The Council: They say you can't argue anybody out of love and it seems to be true. Unfortunately, it isn't only because love is such a powerful emotion, but because the word is often used as a block against all reason by those in need of defenses.

We have the impression that Dora is every bit as worried and frightened by this situation as her mother. The more scared she is, the more she clings to a straw—her belief, based on little or nothing, that Jerry plans to marry her.

Unfortunately, Mrs. M. H. has put things rather harshly. A young girl, dreaming of romance, is naturally resistant to the idea that she should look for material benefits from a man. However, in our society it happens to be one of the means of expressing affection in courtship. There are, of course, other ways, an expensive date that is a little different and reveals some special thought and planning are

also excellent ways of indicating interest. Often they show much more consideration than the easy way—the gift and good time that can be bought by anyone with the money.

But we doubt very much whether Dora has received this consideration. If she had she would be able to point with pride to Jerry's obvious kindness and consideration.

Another consideration offered by men of serious intentions is a clear-cut statement about marriage. A fully adult man who sees one girl steadily for two years and finds himself unable to say anything significant on the subject is stringing somebody along—and it could be himself. He may be using this one girl as a protection against others who may be sharper and more demanding.

We see nothing against Dora's continuing to enjoy this friendship, but we see everything against her banking on it as a marriage possibility. She should make an effort to meet others.

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Nikita Twits at U.S. Moon Rockets
Moscow — (UPI) — Soviet Premier Nikita Khrushchev twitted the American moon rocket which he said "sinks to the bottom of the sea" and credited Russia's scientific success to the Communist way of life in a speech reported Thursday by Moscow Radio.

Khrushchev contrasted the Soviet rocket now in orbit around the moon and the American moonshot failure last week. He said it wasn't money but the lack of Communism that put the U.S. behind.

The Soviet rocket was believed still heading out into space today in its slow swing about the moon in a huge orbit that is not expected to bring it back to the vicinity of the earth for another 10 days.
