Order Signed to Change Names

The Jackson county court last week signed the order effecting certain road name changes north of Central Point. The changes include:

1. Upton rd. west from where it meets Gibbon rd. becomes part of Gibbon rd.;
2. Upton rd. north from the west end of this new part of Gibbon rd. becomes Truax rd.;
3. Upton rd. west from the north end of this new Truax rd. to High Banks rd., and Downing rd. east from the north end of Truax rd. to where it turns south, both become part of a new road known as Newland rd.

Upton rd. from the north city limits of Central Point up to where it meets Gibbon rd. remains Upton rd.

The Jackson county court denied other changes recommended by the county planning commission in the area of Gregory rd.

The order's effective date is Oct. 1.



Company Makes Plea 'Don't Shoot Us'

With hunting season in full swing Pacific Telephone has made its annual "Don't Shoot Us" plea, according to J. H. Creager, manager in Medford. In the past 12 months the company's cables, wires and other equipment throughout the state has been hit by gunfire 218 times. The repair bill was \$10,000.

"Nearly every call for emergency aid — ambulance service, police, fire or a call to a doctor's office travels via telephone wires or cables," Creager said.

Air Defense System — In addition many telephone circuits are part of the nation's air defense warning system. They also are used in many

places for the control of other vital utility services — water, power and gas.

"The end result of shooting telephone cables can be far more serious than just inconvenience to telephone callers or the cost of repairs," according to Creager.

The phone company is reluctant to call its gun shot damage malicious. Most of it is accidental or caused by hunters who do not realize the consequences.

"There's something irresistible about a bird on a telephone wire or cable when a rifle's in hand. Unfortunately, the cable seems to be hit more often than the bird," Creager said.

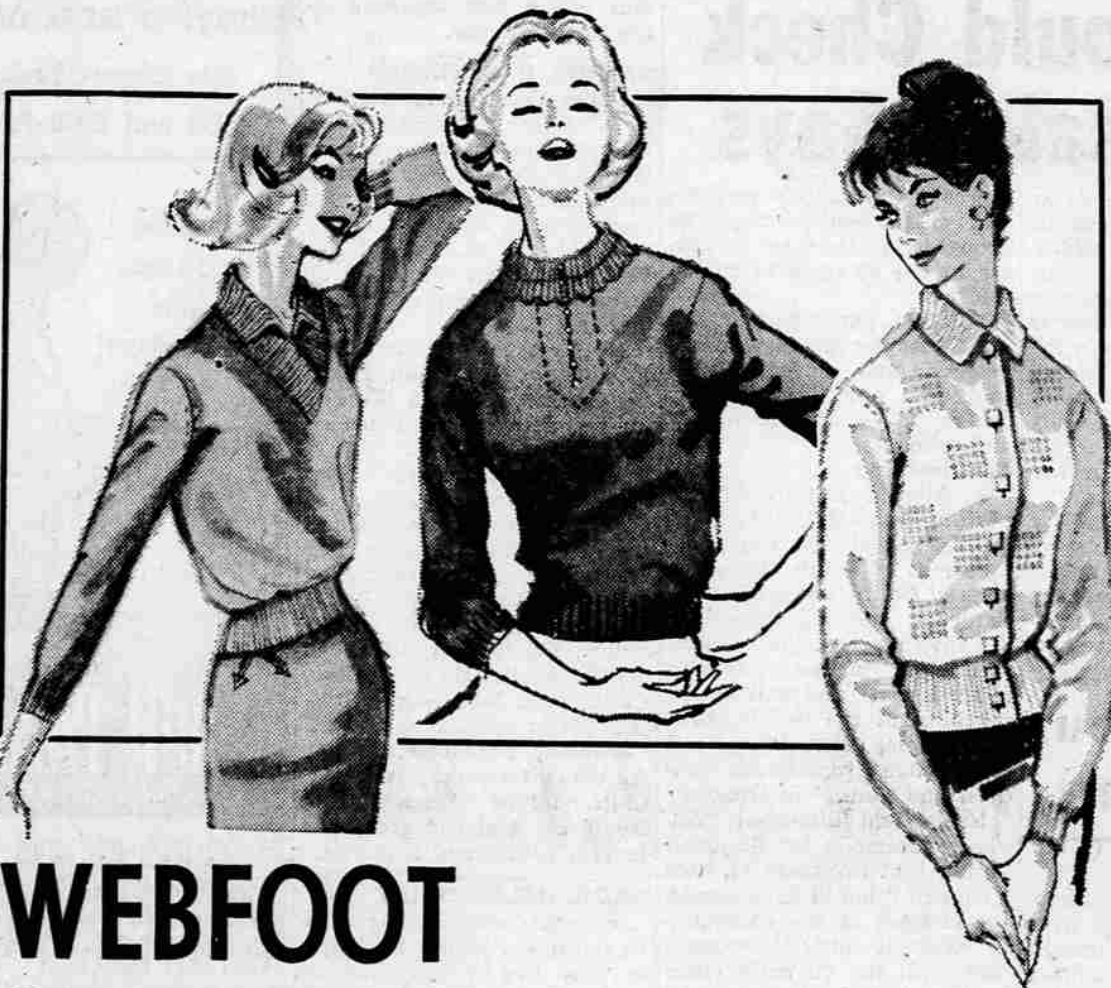

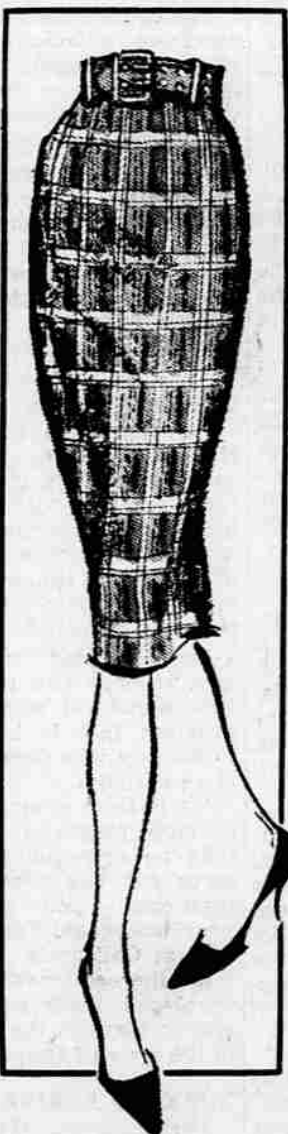
