

Portland Tops All Coast Ports

Portland — (UPI) — The Department of Commerce field office here said Friday that Portland topped all other Pacific coast ports in dry cargo shipments in 1958.

Harold K. Cherry, office manager, said Portland's total was 4,889,000,000 pounds. Most of it was grain.

He said Los Angeles was next with 3,598,000,000, and then Seattle with 3,193,000,000 pounds.

Two other Northwest ports were in the top eight. They were Tacoma, Wash., with 1,823,000,000 pounds and Longview, Wash., 1,688,000,000.

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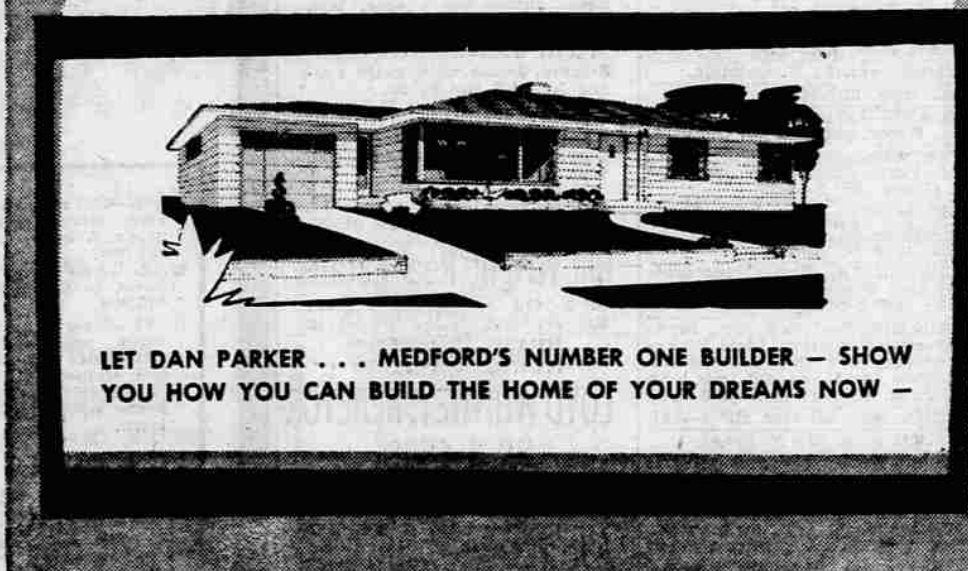
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
