

Field Consultant for Family Services Group Visits in Medford

Mrs. Frieda Burnside, field consultant for the Family Service Association of America, was in Medford last week. She spoke Monday noon at a joint meeting of the Child Guidance Clinic board and the Family Counseling board.

Members of the boards took the opportunity of asking questions of Mrs. Burnside about the expansion of the Child Guidance Clinic now being considered, so that it could include family counseling.

Several of the questions concerned the feasibility of merging the services. She stated that she has had little experience with the problem, because most of the family service agencies up to now have been independent, supported largely by community chest funds.

Ordered Merging

However, she said that in her home city of Topeka, Kans., the Community Chest had ordered the merging of the family agency with the child guidance clinic, and she thought it was working out well. She said she thought that this combining of services might well come to be the pattern for communities of this size. In such a situation, funds might be derived from a variety of sources, as with the present Child Guidance Clinic.

In considering the financial cost of family counseling services, Mrs. Burnside emphasized that it ought to be one of the best preventive services in the community. She said that the cost of providing counseling services should be compared, for example, with the cost of keeping a boy or girl in an industrial school.

Cost Figured

She said that in Kansas they figure the cost about \$5,000 per child, in California about \$6,000. The purpose of the family agency would be to deal with the origin of these problems.

She also called attention to the fact that since 1940, the divorce rate has doubled, the number of juvenile offenders has tripled, and the number of children born out of wedlock has tripled.

Harold Snodgrass, chairman of the Child Guidance Clinic Board, presided over the joint meeting. It was pointed out that at this stage wider discussion in the community or the need for expanded counseling services is much to be desired.

The Child Guidance board would like to know whether professional and service organizations in the community favor making available more professional help for families in trouble.

Preliminary Hearing Set for Local Man

Bail was set at \$2,500.

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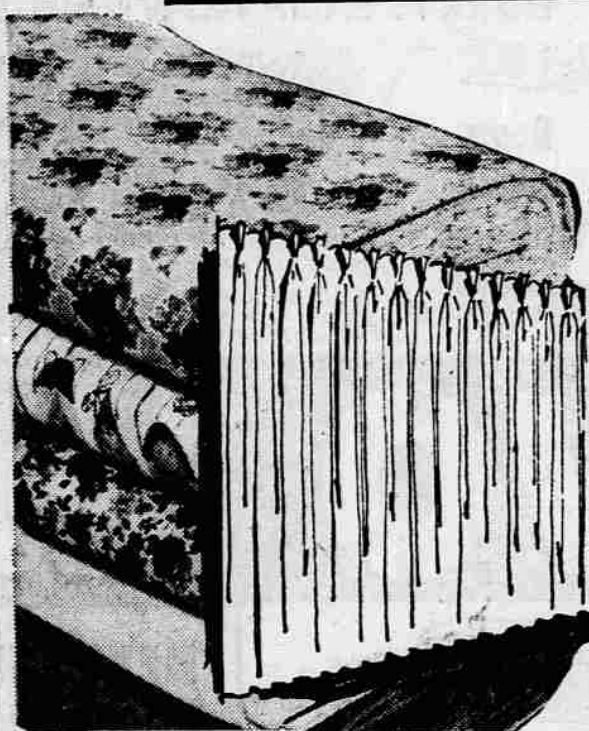
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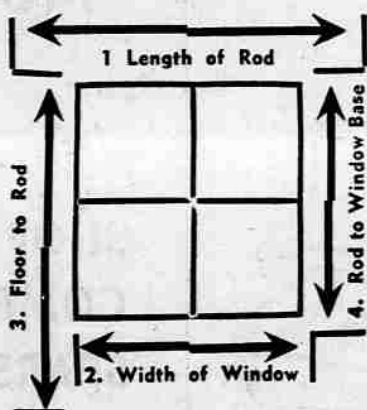
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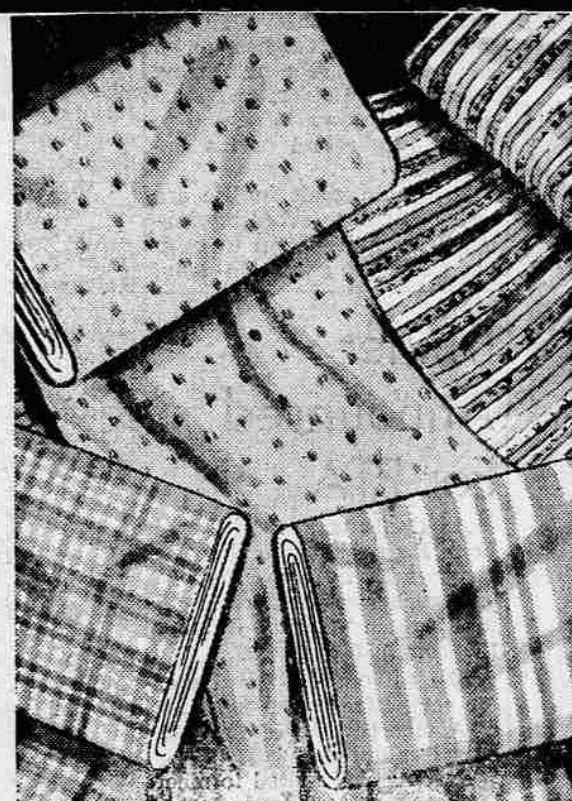
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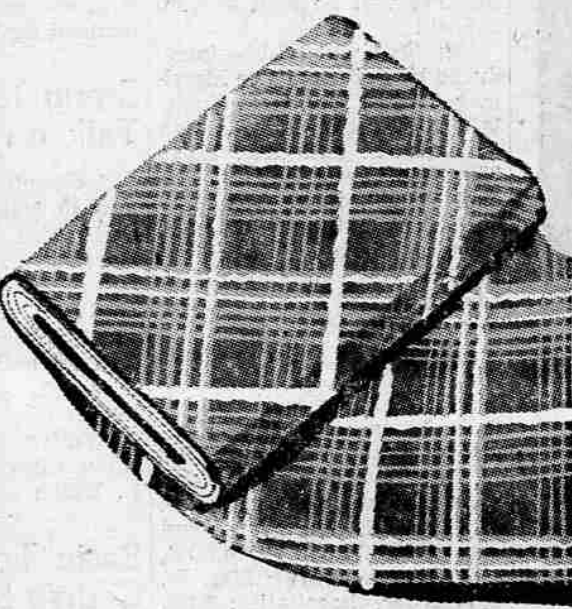
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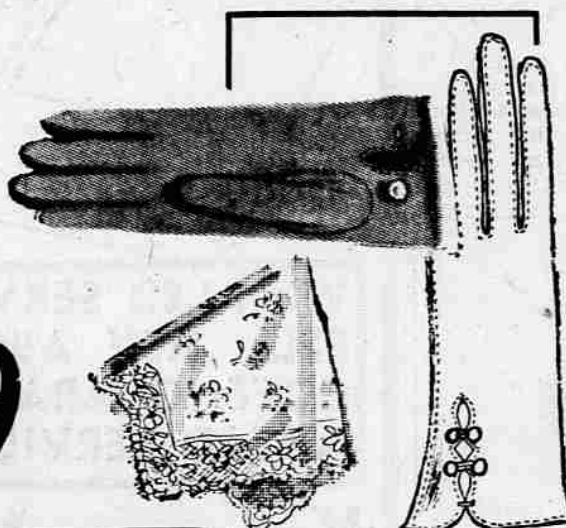
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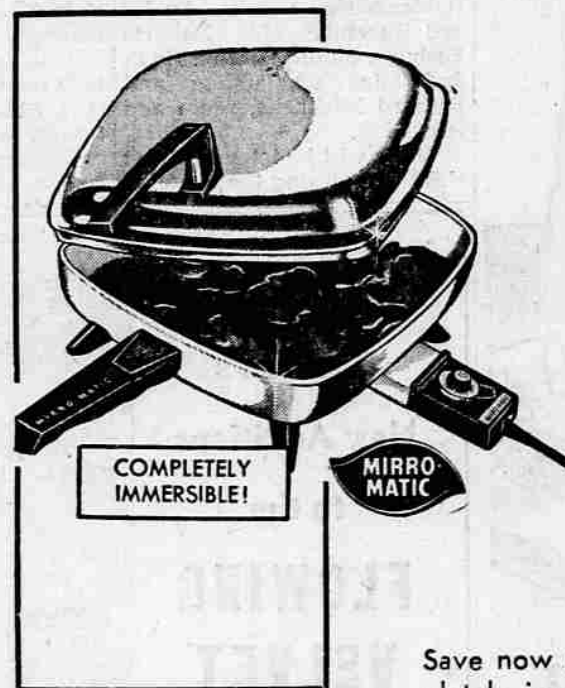
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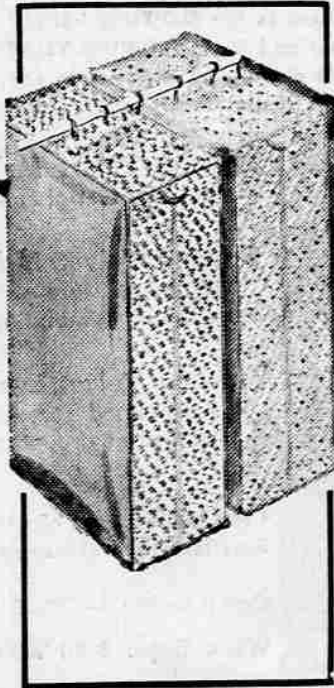
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
