Marcia A. - My brother bosses me.
Mrs. L.A. - She's lucky to have him.

Marcia A. - I am 16 and I'm very unhappy at home because of my older brother, who considers himself my boss, and my parents who side with him in everything. Tim is 17. That's supposed to make him smarter than I am. Actually he is just a baby. He thinks he knows everything. He makes fun of my clothes, my friends, everything I do.

A few weeks ago we were with a group of friends and they drove us over to our house. I kissed my date good night. I have known this boy for three years and dated him all last year. My brother almost started a fight with him and told me he'd knock my block off if he saw me do a thing like that again. My parents sided with Tim. Other girls can do just as they please because they have no brother chaperoning them.

Mrs. L.A. - We feel very fortunate in having Tim keep an eye on Marcia. Not that we don't trust her. We do, but we think with the way kids are today it doesn't hurt to have a big brother around looking out for a girl. Tim says that kiss was the lingering kind. Marcia is too young for that kind of thing.

It is true that Tim is sometimes too critical and he likes to tease. We try to get him to stop teasing. Sometimes he overdoes it. Marcia gets very upset when he criticizes her clothes and the way she acts. But it doesn't hurt for her to know the way boys her age see her.

We feel that Tim has a lot of love and loyalty for his sister. She should consider herself a lucky girl to have him.

The Council: We're with Marcia. A 17-year-old brother is not a suitable chaperone or adviser for a 16-year-old girl. He may have love and loyalty and may mean well, but he is not the best person to be the overseer of her conduct.

In the case of the kiss, for example, we think it more than likely that it was staged for Tim's special benefit - as a matter of spite and teasing. If Marcia were really interested in that kiss she would not give a public showing. Certainly it was in bad taste and is very improper conduct - but so was Tim's public blow-up.

The L.A.'s should face the fact that the chaperone system is out in this country today. They must teach their daughter to be guardian of her own conduct and her own reputation. It is unfair and unrealistic to attempt to saddle her with a chaperone.

We think that an older brother can be very helpful to a young girl, but not if he takes too much upon himself. The L.A.'s should tell Marcia to take some of his criticisms with a few grains of salt. Boys sometimes criticize their sisters for a manner or style of dress they may be attracted to in other girls. Many do it just for the fun of teasing, just to blow off steam or just to keep a kid sister in her place.

As for Marcia, we'd recommend that she stop making a spectacle of herself just to annoy her brother. It isn't worth it.

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Passerby Saves Injured Women

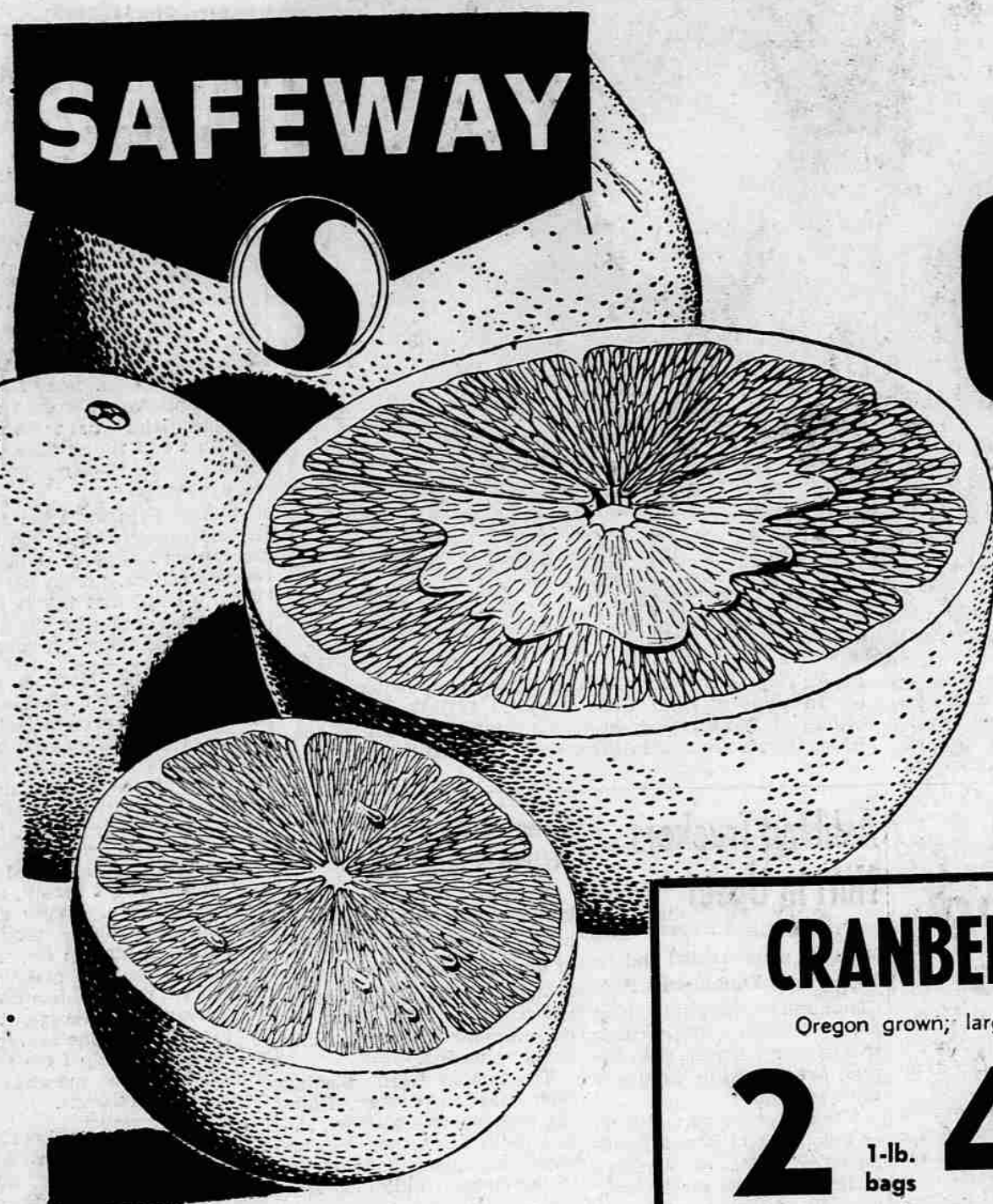
Milwaukee - (UPI) - An unidentified passerby pulled two severely injured young women from the flaming wreckage of their car along Aldercrest rd. here early today.
