Sexual Deviates in Swine

I recently read an interesting article by E. F. Johnston, J. H. Zeller and George Cant, in the well-known journal, U. S. Department of Agriculture. They report having found in the last three years in their experimental herd of swine at Beltsville, Md., at least 25 intersexed pigs including male pseudo-hermaphrodites and true hermaphrodites. All these occurred in one genetic line of swine, and hence, the defect is based on a hereditary tendency. True hermaphrodites have both the female and male organs of reproduction. Interesting is the statement that endocrine (glandular) upsets could be ruled out as the cause for these so-called intersexed types, because, if the animal's glands had been at fault, all the females in the litter should have been similarly affected, and this never happened.

Many persons may ask, But why be interested in those sexually-mixed-up swine? My answer is that I so want the people of America to have sympathy and understanding for boys and girls who are born with these same sexual defects and mix-ups. I keep hoping that some day we will treat these unhappy unfortunates kindly, and with sympathy, just as we treat any other person who became maimed or deformed in his mother's womb. I want all Americans to quit regarding these people as foul, degenerate, obscene, dirty or something. I want our legislators to repeal all of our cruel, stupid, unjust, and medieval laws directed against these people. I want the police in the care of physicians where they belong. I do not want the affected men to be left at the mercy of blackmailers as they are today.

Mark J.: My wife doesn't want my mother to live with us.
Ethel J.: She interferes with my life.
Mark J.: My 79-year-old mother was recently widowed and I want her to come to live with us, but my wife doesn't want her.
I could understand it if my mother were a busybody or cranky or disliked my wife. But nothing could be farther from her nature. Everyone agrees she is the sweetest, grandest old lady who ever lived. She never imposes on anyone and is capable of taking care of all her personal needs.
I provide my family with a beautiful home. Why should my mother live alone in a poky apartment when she could have the run of the house and a lovely room of her own? I feel that my wife is very unsympathetic.
Ethel J.: It is true that my mother-in-law is sweet and pleasant, but in her own sweet way she can make things very hard.
She is a very social person and she likes to be included in everything. When she is with us on a visit I never have a minute either my myself or with my friends. If one of my friends calls and she happens to answer the telephone she has a long conversation with the friend and then hangs up without even calling me. A day later she'll say, "Oh, I forgot, you had a call from so-and-so yesterday."
This may sound silly, but it's just one of her ways of making me feel left out in my own home.
The Council: Those who have had experience in dealing with problems of the aged agree that unnecessary rush decisions should not be made as to living arrangements when an elderly person has been widowed. Too often children make all the decisions in this matter before the widowed parent has managed to get his bearings. The parent comes to eventually and finds that he has given up things he never wanted to give up—peace, independence, security among old friends in old surroundings.
