

1960 Begins To Look Like Big Year for 'Favorite Son' Presidential Candidates

Washington—UPI—It may be too early for a head count, but 1960 looks like a big crop year for "favorite son" presidential candidates.

Some already are stirring—or being stirred by political friends. A few candidacies may not reach full bloom until convention time next summer.

Florida officials think Sen. George A. Smathers (D-Fla.) may announce his formal acceptance of a draft as that state's "favorite son" at a lunch in Miami Friday.

Chandler Enters Race
In Asheville, N.C., Kentucky's ever-running presidential aspirant, Gov. A. B. (Happy) Chandler, brightened the Southern Governors Conference with the word that he'll be in the Democratic presidential race next year.

Democratic governors, who outnumber Republican state leaders 35 to 15, dominate the list of "probable or potential favorite sons."

They include California's Edmund G. (Pat) Brown, Ohio's Michael V. Disalle, Michigan's G. Mennen (Soapy) Williams, and New Jersey's Robert B. Meyner. Other possibilities are Colorado's Stephen L. R. McNichols and Washington's Albert D. Rosellini.

Among Republican governors in this category are William G. Stratton of Illinois and Cecil H. Underwood of West Virginia. New York's Gov. Nelson A. Rockefeller, if he entered the GOP presidential race, would be far more than just a favorite son candidate.

Automatic Favorite Sons
The Senate's four ranking Democratic presidential possibilities are automatic favorite son candidates—if they never reach greater convention glory.

They are Sens. John F. Kennedy of Massachusetts, Hubert H. Humphrey of Minnesota, Stuart Symington of Missouri and Lyndon B. Johnson of Texas.

Traditionally, so-called favorite son candidates are put

Minnesota Governor Plugs for Humphrey

Portland—UPI—Minnesota Democratic Gov. Orville L. Freeman arrived here Monday and declared that the outcome of the May primary in Oregon will have a lot to do with who gets the Democratic nomination for president in 1960.

Freeman, here to help get the campaign for Sen. Hubert Humphrey (D-Minn.) going, met with Humphrey backers at a dinner session Monday night.

Humphrey, still an undecided candidate, was in Oregon all last week speaking throughout the state. The 41-year-old governor, a former classmate of Humphrey, said he thought the senator would announce his stand after the

first of the year. Freeman said that Humphrey "expects to be in the Oregon primary and he expects to win it."

Navy Camera To Survey Sunken Ships

Washington—UPI—The Navy reports it has an underwater television camera that can make visual surveys of sunken ships more than 600 feet below surface.

The camera is mounted in a self-propelled vehicle and can be controlled from the surface. It can hover at any desired depth in currents of several knots. The camera housing also carries an underwater lighting system.

Chinese Troops Grab Outpost in India

Calcutta, India—UPI—The Hindustan Standard reported today that Communist troops from China have seized a second outpost on India's north-east frontier.

A dispatch from Shillong said Red Troops have seized Khinzaman's outpost in the Kameng district as well as Longju, the outpost in the Subansiri district which had previously been reported in Communist hands.

Dacca, Pakistan—UPI—At least 300 persons died within the last few days in a widespread outbreak of cholera in the district of this capital of East Pakistan, unofficial reports showed today.

Eisenhower Receives Variety Of Gifts as Birthday Nears

Washington—UPI—President Eisenhower already has received a flock of gifts ranging from a 440-pound baby elephant to a silver-plated golf putter and his 69th birthday isn't until Wednesday.

The President's other presents included a hand-tooled leather golf bag from Mexican newspaper, radio and TV reporters, three red oak trees and a cake from the Republican National Committee and the Senate and House GOP campaign committees, and a life-size bust of Eisenhower from visiting Mexican President Adolfo Lopez Mateos.

Eisenhower, meanwhile, gave a gift of his own. The White House disclosed that he presented Lopez Mateos with a pale blue 1960 Ford Falcon, one of the new economy-sized

American made automobiles.

The 14-month-old male African elephant, given to Eisenhower Monday at a ceremony on the White House lawn on behalf of the French Community of Nations, was not exactly a birthday present.

The waist-high elephant, named Dzimbo, just happened to arrive in the midst of several days of celebrations marking Eisenhower's birthday.

Dzimbo was turned over to the Washington Zoo.

The putter, a replica of golf immortal Bobby Jones' famous "Calamity Jane" club, was a gift from the White House Correspondents Association. Jones presented it to the surprised President at the group's birthday banquet Monday night.

The golf bag and the bust also were presented at the stag dinner.
