

Bacteria Will Be 'Test Animal' in College Research

Corvallis-Bacteria, normally thought of as an enemy of man, will be used as a "test animal" for man's benefit in basic research on cell behavior at Oregon State college.

Special bacteria are the "guinea pigs" in the study because their cell chemistry is similar to that of man and animals and because some research results can be checked out in a matter of hours or days. With small test animals, it may take weeks or months and research costs are also greater.

The research centers around investigations of normal cell behavior, including how the cells get energy and what they do with it. Long-range objective is to uncover information that may be useful in treating diseases that upset cell behavior and growth.

More of Behavior

Science needs to know much more of the behavior of normal living cells before dealing more effectively with cells that are abnormal. Dr. Vernon H. Cheldelin, head of the Science Research Institute and one of the project leaders, noted.

Special microscopic equipment is used to study the bacteria. Research leads in bacteria tests will later be checked out with test animals, Cheldelin said.

The project, scheduled to continue for five years, will be supported by grants from the National Institute of Health. Grants of \$22,900 have been approved each year for the study, or a combined project total of \$114,506.

In addition to Cheldelin, staff members working on the project are Dr. Tsou E. King and Dr. Annette S. Baich. Graduate research assistants are LeAnna F. Harris, an OSC graduate; Suresh S. Kerwar, India; and Audrey Radomsky, graduate of Walla Walla college, Wash.

U. S. National Notes Deposit Rise

The United States National bank of Portland has marked up more than a \$20 million gain in deposits since September, 1958, according to the comptroller of currency.

Total deposits as of Oct. 6 were \$802,973,949 compared with \$782,155,706 a year ago.

The Medford branch reported deposits totaling \$22,723,653.50, according to Allan F. Perry, manager. Total loans and discounts for the local branch were \$11,554,686.42.

Loans and discounts for the statewide banking system Oct. 6, were \$393,045,982, compared with \$352,457,659 in Sept., 1958.

President E. C. Sammons said the bank added six new branches the past year.
