Linfield Choir Here Wednesday

Linfield college's A Cappella choir will appear at Eastwood Baptist church Oct. 21 at 7:30 p.m. The choir is directed by C. Robert Zimmerman, assistant professor of music at the college, McMinnville.

Organized in 1930 by Virginia Ward Elliott, the Linfield choir was the first such group in the Northwest. The first year of the choir there were 18 members. The student singers have toured in Washington, Oregon, California, Idaho, Utah and Montana. This year the 44-voiced choir will tour southern Oregon and northern California during its fall concert tour.

Mr. Zimmerman, who took over the direction of the group last fall, was conductor of the Portland Symphonic choir which he organized in 1945.
