Old Organization

The society is one of the oldest organizations in the valley. According to early records kept in the museum the first meeting was held Nov. 18, 1876. John Ross was elected president; William Hoffman, secretary; and U. S. Hayden, treasurer. For 83 years the annual meetings have alternated between Jacksonville and Ashland.

The present membership consists of all persons whose ancestors arrived in Oregon before or during the year 1860. Any person connected with a pioneer family of the dates mentioned may join the society and attend the reunions. Dues or assessments are not required. A charge will be made for the dinner.

Three council positions will be filled in the election, which will be held between 8 a.m. and 8 p.m., Tuesday, Nov. 3, in the Jacksonville city hall at the corner of South Oregon and California sts.

Candidates for the three positions are John Caird, Harvey Parrott, John Crabb, Donald Wendt, Ronald McCay and Mrs. Ruth Bowne Walker.

Caird was appointed to fill the unexpired term of E. O. Graham, councilman who was elected Jacksonville mayor in the last city election.

Ernest McIntyre and Robert Welch, present councilmen, are not seeking reelection. Council President Arthur Davies has one more year to complete on his term.
