Training School Starts Today for Police Officers

The Medford police department is host to a five-day basic training school for police officers starting today, according to Chief Charles P. Champlin.

Similar schools are being held in six other Oregon cities this fall to provide basic training for new law enforcement officers and those who wish to review their training.

Officers from Jackson, Josephine, Klamath and Lake counties have been invited to attend the school here, Champlin said.

New patrolmen with the Medford department attending include Dennis Perkins, Glenn Schneider and Stirling Reese. Deputies with the Jackson county sheriff's office scheduled to attend are Bjorne Bjornsen, Kaye Vaughn, William C. Rice Jr., and John O'Hara.

The sessions, which start daily at 9 a.m., are held in the city council chambers at the city hall.

Classes will be on report writing, patrol techniques, mechanics of arrest, basic use of sidearms, traffic patrol, enforcement and case preparation, office-violator contact, court appearances by officers, public relations, laws, laws of arrest, search and seizure, and crime scene investigation.

Instructors include Chief John T. Truett, Bend; Lt. Thomas W. Simmons, Portland bureau of police; Lt. Earl W. Tichenor, Oregon state police; and Special Agent Max E. Taylor of the federal bureau of investigation.

At the close of the school an examination will be given. Officers who receive a satisfactory score and have attended at least four days of the school will be given a certificate of completion.

Schools will be held also in Pendleton, Roseburg, Corvallis, Salem, McMinnville and Eugene.

Women Climbers Die in Himalayas

New Delhi — UP — Two members of an all-women climbing expedition were killed with two Sherpa guides when a blizzard caught them near the top of the 26,387-foot "turquoise goddess" mountain in the high Himalayas, it was reported here Saturday.

The European women and three Sherpa women — two of them daughters of famed Sherpa Tenzing Norkay who conquered Mount Everest with Sir Edmund Hillary — were at a camp 23,000 feet up the treacherous slope when the storm engulfed them. Five other European women in the 12-member party were believed to be at the camp.

First reports quoting the foreign ministry of the Himalayan kingdom of Nepal failed to give the time of the accident or the full details.

The two victims were identified as Mrs. Claude Kogan, 39, of France, and Miss Claudine Van Der Stratten, 26, of Belgium.

Mrs. Kogan, who held the woman's climbing record, had reached 25,496 feet on the mountain before turning back in the 1954 expedition. Her husband was killed in a mountaineering accident several years ago.

Mrs. Kogan, four feet, four inches tall, had been the leader of the expedition designed to let women conquer the mountain known as Cho Oyu, which men had climbed twice before.

To get to it, the women had to trek through part of Tibet and past one Communist Chinese checkpoint, Mount Cho Oyu, which natives call the turquoise goddess, is near Mount Everest, the world's highest mountain, conquered in 1953.

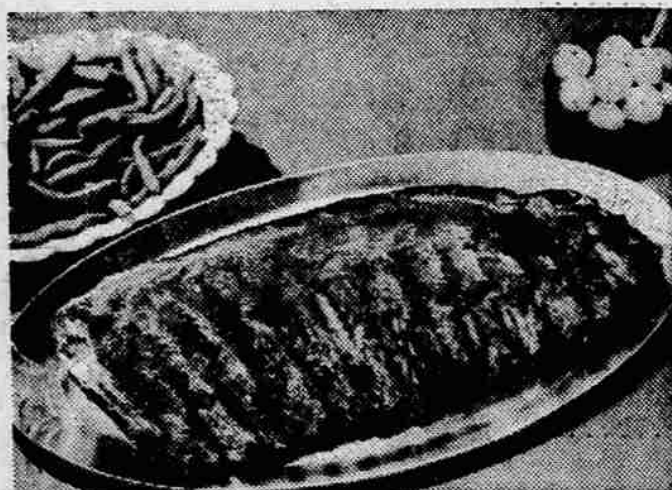

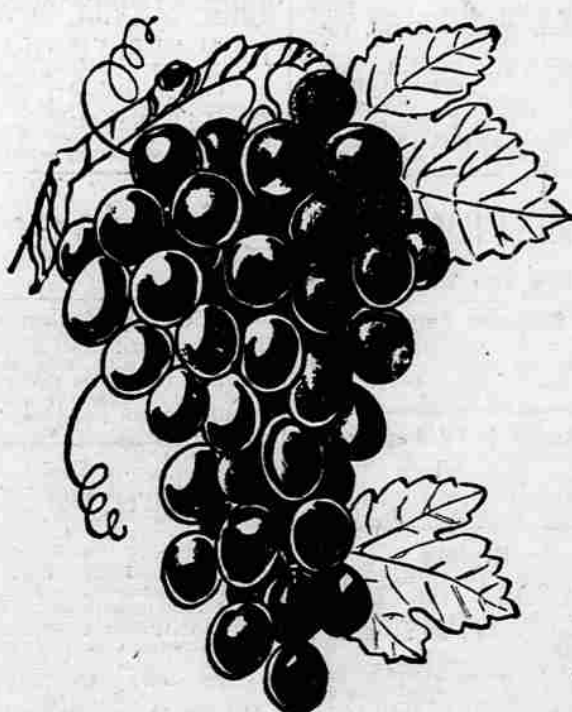
