Editor's note: The Family Council consists of a judge, a psychiatrist, three clergymen, a newspaper editor, a women's editor and two writers. Each article is a summary of an actual report. The Family Council does not give advice; it merely reports on problems that have been dealt with by responsible agencies and counselors.

Bertha S. - He has entered second childhood.
Frank S. - She's just jealous.

Bertha S. - My husband and I are in our mid-50s and have three happily married children. We are in a position to enjoy life - and we would if my husband hadn't decided to enter second childhood.

Every time we go out with other couples these days Frank picks out the prettiest woman and spends the evening flirting and making passes. This is bad enough when it happens with people of our age, but it is worse when he starts making a play for the younger girls. They are terribly annoyed with him.

When I criticize him, Frank calls me jealous. It's not that I'm jealous. I just feel that he makes a fool of himself.

Frank S. - In spite of what she says, Bertha has always been the jealous type. She never has let me look at another woman and is furious now because I've managed to get off her leash.

She knows very well that I'm just kidding around and having fun with these flirtations. Most women like flattery and I enjoy seeing them sparkle when they get a few compliments. Even the young ones aren't annoyed as Bertha thinks. A couple have told me I'm charming.

When we go out Bertha puts on a long face and sits and glares at me all evening. When we come home she starts this "second childhood" bit. I'm fed up.

The Council: We aren't in a position to judge which came first, Frank's flirting or Bertha's "long face" and cruel criticism, but we are sure that one has a lot to do with the other.

Most wives feel uncomfortable about husbands who flirt. Even when they know the flirting is innocent, they feel that they have been placed in an awkward position. They are forced to show their displeasure or put on a false complacency. They can't pos-

sibly be entirely at ease at social gatherings if this is going on.

On the other hand, a husband who feels terribly restrained by a continually disapproving wife is sometimes glad of a chance to thoroughly express himself at social gatherings. He knows that his wife won't make a scene until they get home so he concentrates on it.

If it is true that Frank makes passes at various women, we think he must be the first to act in this case. He should quit it. But we think it possible that Bertha is exaggerating a bit. Frank speaks of paying compliments and of enjoying the company of pleasant women. We think he is entirely in order here and Bertha is wrong to dash cold water on the situation with her talk of "second childhood." This remark is cruel and should not be used without real justification.

In general, Bertha would be wise to think in positive terms rather than negative ones. She should try to improve her own appearance, make an effort to be lively and charming in company. She may soon find that the delightful and attentive man beside her is none other than her husband.
