**A New Technic in Cataract Operations**

A number of people have obviously been hearing of a new drug which will very quickly separate the lens in the eye from its supports. This, of course, makes it easier for the eye surgeon to remove the lens during an operation for a cataract. But the doctor first makes a cut, and then drops a little of the medicine into the front of the eye to loosen up the lens. Many people are now confused about this; they think the medicine is something they can take by mouth to dissolve their cataract, but this is a complete misapprehension. So far as I can learn there is no drug which dissolves cataracts. Only diathermy quacks advertise that they have such a drug.

**The Rh Trouble**

Women by the hundred keep asking me about the Rh troubles which they fear they will have if they have a child. I keep telling them that, so far as I can learn, much of this fear is unjustified. Few of the children of these women come to grief on account of the Rh factor. If I were a woman expecting a child, I would leave the whole problem up to my obstetrician. He knows how to watch out for this kind of trouble, and he knows how to handle the situation if it should show up. There are ways of saving the child if he or she should get jaundiced. In most cases the child gets by very nicely.

**Operations for Deafness**

Any number of people write asking where they should go to get their ears operated on for deafness. I always say, "Before you travel a long distance, for goodness' sake, go to your local good ear doctor and find out what kind of deafness you have. If you have a nerve deafness, there is no sense in traveling far for an operation." An operation can help only with certain types of deafness.

**People Who Need An Eye Operation**

Many people ask me if they should have a cataract out, or perhaps some other operation performed on their eyes. Practically, I have to say to them, "Go to a good ophthalmologist (eye doctor with a medical degree) and get his opinion; then take his advice."
