

### Rockets To Check Wind, Radiation

Washington (Science Service) — The U.S. is scheduled to fire ten rockets during the week of Nov. 16-22 as its contribution to International Rocket Week.

None of the rockets are to place payloads in orbit. Rather they will probe the rim of space then fall back to earth. They will measure up per atmosphere winds 150 miles high, solar X-ray and Lyman-alpha emissions, water vapor in 18- to 60-mile-high air, charge densities between 50 and 1,000 miles that affect radio transmission, magnetic fields and micrometeorites. A special attempt will be made to record with high resolution part of the solar spectrum.

The firings will be part of the research program of the International Geophysical Cooperation-1959, the program that succeeded the International Geophysical Year.

Cooperating will be the National Aeronautics and Space Administration, the Army Ballistic Research Laboratories, the Air Force Geophysics Research Directorate, the Naval Research Laboratory and the Government of Canada.

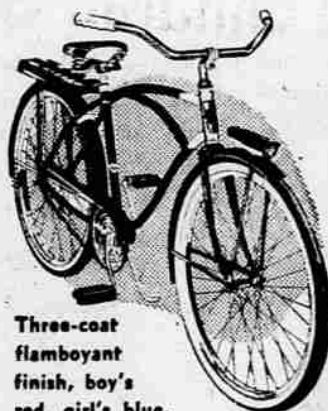

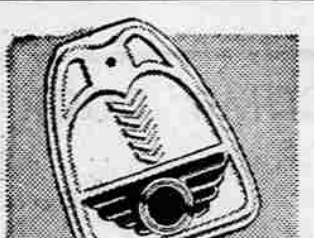
