

Stubblefield Twins Said Out of Danger

Portland —(UPI)— Jeanett and Denett, the tiny Stubblefield twins, Thursday were declared in satisfactory condition at the University of Oregon Medical school hospital here.

It was the first time the girls, born Siamese, had been off the critical list since they were separated in a five-hour operation Oct. 6.

"Their conditions are now satisfactory and the outlook is favorable," a hospital source said.

Both have been improving steadily during the past week, doctors said. Both have gained weight and are taking four ounces of formula every four hours.

Hollywood —(UPI)— Errol Flynn's second wife said Thursday night she planned a court fight over the late actor's estate.

Mrs. Nora Eddington Flynn Haymes, mother of two of Flynn's four children, said she hired attorney Saul Ross to find a will she said Flynn made three years after the one filed for probate Wednesday in New York.

The filed will, dated April 27, 1954, left most of Flynn's estate to his widow, Patrice Wymore, with specific bequests to his children and parents.

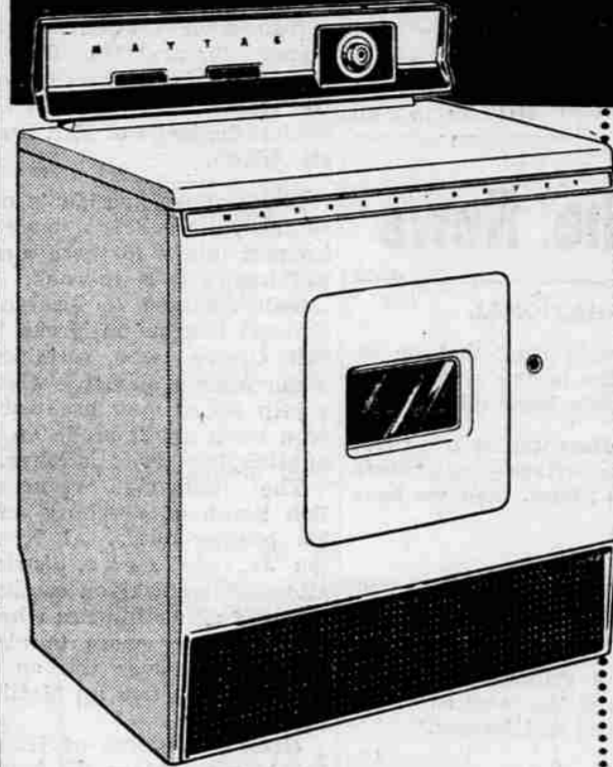

Superior Student Concern Expressed

Ashland — Eminent concern for the education of the superior student is reflected in the recently published resolutions of the Pacific Northwest Conference on Higher Education which was held at the Southern Oregon college last summer.

Mrs. Mabel W. Winston, conference steering committee chairman and SOC dean of women, reported that the resolutions were strongly worded in favor of providing adequately for the seriously neglected superior students at all levels - elementary, secondary, and higher education - in a continuous and integrated program.

Urgent recommendations to all member institutions in regard to the handling of superior students called for their earliest possible identification and counseling; a careful analysis of each based upon the differences which exist among such students; and broadening of curricular offerings to include special honors programs, advanced placement, and independent study consistent with the nature and goals of each institution.

Portland Local To Vote on Swift Deal
