Navy To Build Gooney Bird Nests

Washington—(AP)—The Navy, in deference to bird lovers, has ordered the Seabees to carve out some new nesting spots for the gooney birds that pester Navy aircraft at Midway Island.
 The Navy said Thursday it would spend \$110,000 to remove dunes lining its Midway aircraft runways and to pave the areas to discourage nesting by the birds, known more formally as Laysan albatrosses.
 It already has hacked out 19 fifty-foot "runways" for gooney birds' nesting and flying at Green Island in the Kure Atoll, 50 miles from Midway.
 The Navy hopes this will lure some of the birds away from Midway, which is used by big Navy Constellation airplanes which patrol the Pacific. The service said 538 collisions between gooney birds and planes at Midway last year caused \$156,000 in damage.
 Bird lovers argue the gooney birds are in danger of becoming extinct if they continue to be killed by planes at Midway.
