Little-regarded Pacific and upset-minded Lewis and Clark Saturday tossed the Northwest conference title race into an uproar with stunning wins.

Pacific out-played College of Idaho at Forest Grove for a muddy 16-0 win and Lewis and Clark dumped Whitman from the ranks of the unbeaten and untied by a 26-14 score at Walla Walla.

Defending Champion Willamette and Linfield battled to a 19-19 tie at McMinnville to put Willamette and College of Idaho in a tie for the conference lead with Lewis and Clark and Whitman right behind.

Pacific's hard-charging forward will never give the Coyotes passing wizard Charlie Alvaro a chance. Alvaro managed to complete 11 of 17 passes, but only for 88 yards.

Jack Abdie scored three touchdowns as quarterback Royce McDaniel guided Lewis and Clark to its triumph. McDaniel passed for two scores, one to Abdie for 45 yards.

Quarterback Bill Parrish fired a 15-yard scoring pass to Bill Dressel with 1:17 left to give Linfield its tie with Willamette. Parrish scored one touchdown on a one-yard carry play.

## Eddie Machen, McMurtry Vie

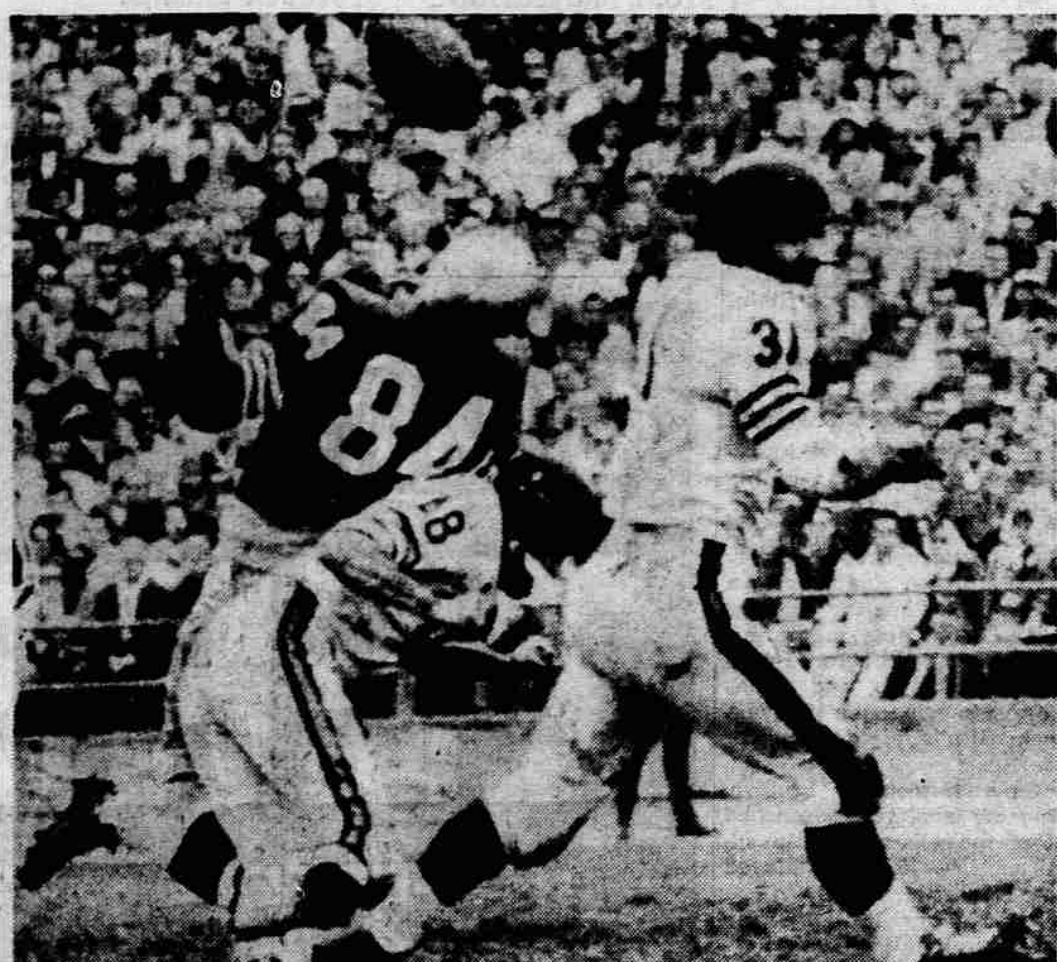

The New York Giants, Baltimore Colts and San Francisco Forty-Niners believe the best offense is a good defense and have the first-place credentials to prove it.

New York has taken some of its worst whippings in Pittsburgh and needed its powerful defensive unit to salvage a 21-16 victory over the Steelers Sunday at Forbes Field.

The triumph, a costly one which may sideline all-league halfback Frank Gifford for two weeks, enabled the Giants 4-1 to hold their one-game lead in the National Football league's Eastern division.

The Green Bay Packers started Sunday's action tied with the Colts and Forty-Niners for the Western lead. The Packers (3-2) scored early in the third period at Baltimore to make the score 14-11.

The Baltimore defense, combined with the passing of John Unitas, triggered three quick touchdowns and the Colts won easily, 38-21.

San Francisco, which has allowed only 65 points, kept pace with Baltimore (each 4-1) when Y. A. Tittle's 46-yard pass to R. C. Owens in the final 65 seconds produced a 20-17 victory over the Chicago Bears.

**Browns Tounce Redskins**  
The Cleveland Browns and Philadelphia Eagles (each 3-2) remained a game behind the Giants. Milt Plum threw four touchdown passes while sparking Cleveland to an easy, 34-7 victory over the Washington Redskins.

The Eagles, aided by alert defensive play and Norm Van Brocklin's passes, erased a 24-0 deficit in the second half and edged the Chicago Cardinals (1-4), 28-24.

## LA's Rams All But Out In Pro Race

Los Angeles - (UPI) - The Los Angeles Rams were all but out of the National Football league title race today and had little to look to other than the role of "spoilers" for the remainder of the season.

The Rams dropped into fourth place in the Western division at 2 wins and 3 losses after dropping a 17-to-7 game to Detroit Sunday. The win was the Lions' first of the official season.

"I can't figure it out, we aren't just that bad," coach Sid Gillman said in analyzing the defeat witnessed by 74,288 fog chilled fans. "I just can't figure it out. We aren't that bad."

**Best Detroit Effort**  
"It was our best all around effort of the year," explained Lions coach George Wilson.

The Rams turned in one of their poorest efforts of the year. They were ineffective both on the ground and in the air.

It was the Lion line, namely Gil Mains, Alex Karras, Bill Glass, backed up by one of the NFL's top linebackers Joe Schmidt, that stopped the vaunted Ram running game - holding Los Angeles to a skimpy 24 yards in the first half.

And usually accurate Bill Wade was having one of his rare wild days, throwing long on the deep plays and wide on the short over the center passes. To top it off, three of his aerials were intercepted.

The interceptions and three lost fumbles set up the Lions for their scores and gave them ball control, particularly in the first half.

## Alley-oop Pass Gives SF Victory

San Francisco - (UPI) - San Francisco's surprising Forty Niners have almost reached the halfway point of the National Football league season - and thanks to R. C. Owens and his pogo-stick heroics, find themselves still tied for first place.

Owens vaulted high into the air Sunday to snag a 46-yard "Alley-oop" touchdown pass from Y. A. Tittle with only 1:01 remaining in the game, giving the Forty Niners a come-from-behind 20-17 victory over the Chicago Bears.

R. C., a 6-3 1/2 ex-basketball star who initiated the "Alley-oop" during his sensational 1957 rookie year with the Forty Niners, hasn't been able to nail down a starting position this season.

But he was in the game - and the end zone - at the right time Sunday. He was flanked by Bear defenders J. C. Caroline and Erich Barnes in touchdown territory, but for some reason, neither defender left the ground as Owens leaped for the catch.

Chicago took its fourth loss of the season against one win Sunday - but until Tittle's game-winning pitch, it looked as if the Bears had a victory.

Chicago's star quarterback Ed Brown had maneuvered the Bears to a 17-13 lead only 53 seconds before San Francisco's game-winner. Brown passed three times for 84 yards and pay-dirt, the touchdown pass a 30-yarder to Ed Dooley.

## Tittle Debated About Throwing

San Francisco - (UPI) - Quarterback Y. A. Tittle of the San Francisco Forty-Niners said he didn't know whether to pass or try running for a first down when he heaved a 46-yarder to R. C. Owens to beat the Chicago Bears in the final seconds Sunday, 20-17.

Tittle said he debated whether to pass or run while dashing to his right with the Bear defenders in hot pursuit. Owens, waiting in the end zone to make one of his "alley oop" leaps, had no trouble making up his mind.

"I thought to myself 'Oh, no, throw it, throw it' when I thought he might try to run with the ball," Owens said.

Tittle and Owens beat the Bears in 1957 with their "Alley oop" passes in the final seconds.
