New York —(UPI)—Widespread nervousness in Wall Street contrasts sharply with continuing bullish in markets abroad — especially in London where they're still celebrating the Conservative election triumph, says Prentice-Hall.

Tight money, steel shortages and tax selling will continue to unsettle influences in the weeks ahead, P-H says in its weekly report on business.

Also, it points out, the long-term investor should be able to find good bargains in stocks being sold for tax losses.

Electronics Magazine forecasts a rise in defense electronics sales next year with the biggest increases in research and development, missile guidance systems, computer controls and air defense networks.

Standard & Poor's outlook says Acme Steel, which has held up well and should soon have the support of improving earnings, still has appeal for accounts that can speculate in secondary steel issues.

Anacosta Co. is in the bargain area with its shares dealt to the point where excellent value in the situation again abounds, notes the Fitch Survey.

Printers Ink magazine reports that the big three automakers are expected to meet strong consumer resistance on the grounds of safety and comfort. Meanwhile, it noted, Chrysler's marketing plans for the Valiant are to de-emphasize economy and stress comfort and styling.

The Family Council

Editor's Note: The Family Council consists of a Judge, a psychiatrist, three clergymen, a newspaper editor, a women's editor and two writers. Each article is a summary of an actual case history. The Council reports on problems that have been dealt with by responsible agencies and counselors.

Victor F. — There is no freedom of speech in our house.

Mr. M. F. — He has gotten obnoxious.

Victor F. — Is it right for a father to insist upon winning every argument just because he happens to be the parent? I am 15 and I am a Democrat. My father is a Republican and we fight all the time. My father doesn't have his facts straight and I have often caught him in downright false statements. When I brought him the proof he just shrugged.

We fight about other things too. My father thinks he knows a lot about science, but he doesn't. In my school we have very advanced classes in science and I know a lot of things my father doesn't begin to suspect. But he shuts me up whenever I talk up. Freedom of speech doesn't apply in our house. I sure would like to appeal my case to the Supreme Court.

Mr. M. F. — Victor was always a bright boy and we gave him a lot of encouragement to speak up — maybe a little too much encouragement. Things have gotten to the point where he is very fresh and has become obnoxious at times.

I have no objection to his being a Democrat, but I certainly do object to his monopolizing the conversation at all times. Recently we had my boss and his wife over to dinner and he proceeded to tell my boss just how the country should be run. When he was a kid people used to think

these antics of his were cute, but now they become annoying.

Victor also keeps up a constant harangue about his ideas. He loves to catch me in minor errors, which I must admit I sometimes make.

The Council: All teenagers want to assert their importance and independence and they often do it in a childish, annoying fashion.

This can be a trying time for parents, but it need not result in constant bickering. Victor, like all teenagers, primarily wants recognition and respect. If his father will meet these needs at least halfway, he may be able to better control the situation.

We don't think Victor should be given the right to monopolize every conversation and he certainly shouldn't be permitted to annoy his parents' guests. It can be pointed out that he would not like it if his father took over the stage when he has had his friends at the house. He certainly shouldn't have been permitted to have free rein to show off when he was a youngster. Outsiders may have said he was "cute," but it is likely that they were bored and irritated even then.

The fact that Victor has a lively interest in things and wants to discuss them with his father is a sign that the relationship is basically a good one. It just requires more molding and adjustment as Victor gets on in years.

Probably it would be a good idea if Mr. M. F. set a more or less regular time and place for discussion with his son. Victor should be taught that the dinner table is not the best place because political disputes can get hot and there is a tendency for two combatants to monopolize the conversation. Everyone in the family should get a chance to chat at the dinner table. Victor should also be taught to keep his comments to a minimum when his parents entertain.

Mr. M. F. should try to discipline himself to fair and open discussion with his son. He should feel and show pride when Victor scores a significant point. This will train him in civilized debate.

Reds Try to Spy on Nixon, Official Says

Washington —(UPI)—Soviet officials insisted on redecorating the Moscow residence of Vice President Richard M. Nixon prior to his visit last July in an apparent effort to plant eavesdropping devices.

The Russian tactics were disclosed today after Russell Langelle, ousted U.S. security officer in Moscow, told a news conference that the Soviets tried to spy on Nixon. Langelle said Monday he thwarted the Red espionage efforts.

According to reliable sources, Soviet officials insisted on installing two new chandeliers in Spasso House, the U.S. Embassy residence where Nixon stayed. This was described as subterfuge to plant hidden eavesdropping equipment.

The sources said the Soviets also tried to rig the telephones in Spasso House in such a manner that they would become microphones as soon as they were placed in their cradles at the end of a call.

Nixon's office had no comment on the reports.

Cancer Surgeon Believes That 'Pattern' May Emerge Soon

New York —(UPI)—A leading cancer surgeon believes a "pattern" is going to emerge from scientific research which will enable physicians to prevent cancers from ever getting started rather than "concentrating on destructive attempts to eradicate already established malignant tumors."

Dr. Denely P. Slaughter, professor of surgery, University of Illinois, was impressed by such scientific findings as these:

Cirrhosis of the liver can have a bearing not only on liver tumors "but much more importantly" on the development of cancers in the mouth, "and, quite probably, on the origin of cancer in other sites."

The "interplay" among the hormones secreted by the endocrine glands has a connection in "a given individual" with the start of cancers in some body tissues.

So do various body conditions unrelated to cancer which cause body chemistry to misuse vitamins or to absorb them badly.

"It is already apparent that many other etiologic causative factors are related to the onset of neoplasia," he told

the annual meeting of the American Cancer Society.

He expected much to come from investigations of viruses as possible causes of cancers and of the body's natural defenses against cancers.

These "are just entering into a crescendo phase of im-

portance in our studies of the basic causes of, and reactions to cancer," he said.

Let all these efforts be "greatly intensified," we can "prevent disease when the cause is known and can be eliminated." The causes of cancers in aniline dye workers and chimney sweeps are down, and those cancers are being prevented. And so it will be with other cancers.

Slaughter spoke on the question, "what is early cancer?" He was one of the expert members of a symposium which is devoting two days to evaluating ways of early detection of cancer in various body sites.

"It is still generally true that the earlier a malignant tumor is diagnosed, the greater is the chance to eliminate it by adequate treatment," he said. "Nevertheless, it still is preferable that the tumor not occur in the first place."
