

**Nobel Winner
Lauds Moon Photo**

Washington - (UP) - Nobel Prize scientist Dr. Harold C. Urey says the Soviet photograph of the moon's far side is "an outstanding technical achievement" which should spur this country to greater efforts in space.

Urey agreed with other scientists here that the Russian photo was not detailed enough to warrant conclusions about the nature of the moon's other side.

But he said it was impossible to exaggerate the technical skill which enabled the Russians to get the picture at all.

"It is time," Urey said Tuesday "that we get up out of our chairs and begin to compete with them in space. It is not good for us to kid ourselves that we are up with them. We are not. I think it will be years before we are."

Some astronomers, who did not want to be quoted by name, also stressed what one called the "marvelous technical accomplishment" in a letter by the photograph.

One scientist said the technique used by the Russians could have tremendous military significance.

**Bomber Crashes;
Crewmen Escape**

Hattiesburg, Miss. - (UP) - A huge B-58 jet, the Air Force's fastest and most modern bomber, crashed and exploded in a wooded area near here Tuesday night. It carried a crew of three civilian experts.

Officials said the big swept-wing plane did not carry a nuclear device, as was earlier reported from the crash scene. Finding of a piece of wreckage labeled, "caution radioactivity" led to the report.

The three crewmen parachuted from the craft at an altitude of 25,000 feet.

The pilot, Everett L. Wheeler, 41, from Fort Worth, Tex., and a second crewman, Michael F. Keller, also 41 and from Fort Worth, were found shortly after the crash. A third crewman, Harry N. Blosser, 35, of the Fort Worth suburb of Lake Worth, was reported missing.

All were employed by Convair Aircraft Corp.

**Pope Marks First
Year as Pontiff**

Vatican City - (UP) - Pope John XXIII Wednesday celebrated his first year in office with a special audience for 200 peasants and churchmen from his home district out no ceremonies.

The Pope was chosen to succeed Pope Pius XII a year ago today. He was selected by his fellows of the College of Cardinals behind sealed doors, 19 days after his predecessor's death.

Pope John told his audience that he would like to show them around Rome but since becoming Pope he is a prisoner.

"Unfortunately, I am a prisoner," he said sadly. "I cannot do what I want to do. Every time there are 40 people who tell me what I have to do."

"Each of these has a precise job, just as I have the task of being head of the church. Each of these has the job to counsel me."

The Pope's special audience with his former neighbors ran nearly an hour beyond its scheduled time.

**Martians May Be
Waiting Chance**

United Nations - (UP) - Don't give us all your armaments, the Portuguese delegate warned the United Nations Tuesday. It may be just what the Martians are waiting for.

Dr. Vasco Viera Garin told the General Assembly Political Committee about the danger from outer space during a debate on the Soviet plan for "general and complete disarmament."

"It is certainly far-fetched, but perhaps not at all absurd, the way things are moving nowadays on this planet, to imagine a sudden invasion of our earth by aggressive warriors from another celestial body," he said.

"In such an emergency the security forces of our world, including the Soviet detachment, would cut a poor figure against Martians . . . If we had, figuratively speaking, only kitchen knives and pocket slings to defend ourselves."

**U. S., Russ Outlays
Said About Equal**

Washington - (UP) - The U. S. and Russian outlays for defense and related programs in 1960 will be about equal.

The arms race will continue at its present rate, barring an abrupt change in the current uncheerful outlook for controlled disarmament. The space race will be intensified. These forecasts came today from officials familiar with the 1960 Soviet budget just made public in Moscow and with the new U. S. budget being prepared to be sent to Congress in January.

Prospects are that the two countries will continue to invest annually about 45 billion dollars each in military and related fields.

**Request To Return
To Jail Turned Down**

Ancona, Italy - (UP) - Warden Eugenio Taddei said Wednesday he had "regretfully" refused a request from Francesco Tocco to come back to jail.

Tocco, after finishing a 14-year murder sentence, asked to be allowed to return because he found life on the outside "too difficult."
