Washington - UP - House investigators hinted Saturday they can show who pocketed the \$10,000 which a department store was said to have paid to get an employee on a television quiz show.

The development came as the House subcommittee investigating rigged TV quizzes prepared to resume its sensational hearings Monday by questioning Charles Van Doren, \$129,000 winner on the "21" program.

Still unsettled was the question of whether Van Doren would testify in public on whether he was supplied with questions and answers before his TV appearances.

Steel Industry Seizure Denied

Washington - UP - The White House denied Saturday that the administration is making any studies of plans to seize the strike-bound steel industry.

Press Secretary James C. Hagerty made the denial in response to a question about a speech at Pebble Beach, Calif., Friday by Secretary of Commerce Frederick H. Mueller before a group of business executives.

Hagerty said a news dispatch saying that Mueller had hinted at the possibility of government seizure was only a reporter's interpretation.

"I read the speech and I wouldn't get that from it," he said.

(Pebble Beach dispatches said Mueller dropped such a hint when he was asked repeatedly if his statements suggested seizure and he refused to confirm or deny this.)
